#### Introduction

The story of Esther is one of the most compelling biblical narratives about courage, faith, and divine destiny. As a young Jewish woman who became queen, Esther faced seemingly insurmountable challenges that called for extraordinary bravery. Her willingness to approach King Xerxes without invitation, risking her life to save her people, exemplifies what it means to trust God and act with boldness despite fear.

Courage is not the absence of fear, but rather the triumph over it. Esther's journey reminds us that God often places us in critical positions for His purposes and equips us to fulfill His will when we lean on Him. Through this 5-day Bible study plan, you will explore key moments in Esther's story and related Scriptures that reveal the nature of courage — rooted in faith, prayer, and obedience.

Each day will prompt reflection, journaling, and prayer to help you grow in your own walk of trust and fearless action. Whether you face personal battles, leadership responsibilities, or moments of uncertainty, Esther's example encourages you to step forward with confidence, knowing God is with you. Prepare your heart to encounter the courage God offers to overcome fear and make a lasting impact for His kingdom.

















#### Your Verse

Esther 4:14 - For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Joshua 1:9 Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go.
- Psalm 27:1 The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?







#### Devotional: Faith Ignites Bold Courage

Esther's courage was anchored deeply in her faith in God's sovereignty and His plan for her people. When faced with the fatal dilemma of approaching the king unsummoned, she understood that silence meant doom not only for herself but for all the Jews. Mordecai's stirring words in Esther 4:14 reveal a profound truth: God's deliverance can come in unexpected ways—but He often calls us to be His instruments.

As believers today, our courage begins in faith, trusting that God is with us in every trial. Joshua reminds us that God commands His people to be strong and courageous, promising His abiding presence in every circumstance. Likewise, David declares that with God as our light and salvation, fear loses its grip.

Reflect on your own life: Where is God asking you to rise in courage? How does trusting Him shift your perspective on fear? Let faith be your shield as you face the challenges ahead.

#### Your Verse

Esther 4:16 - Go, gather together all the Jews who are in Susa, and fast for me. Do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my attendants will fast as you do.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 3:5-6 Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.
- Hebrews 13:6 So we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?'







#### Devotional: Obedience Fuels Courageous Action

Esther's decision to fast and seek God's guidance illustrates that courage is not reckless but grounded in obedience and dependence on God. She recognized the gravity of her calling and prepared spiritually before stepping into a dangerous confrontation with the king. This deliberate act shows how faithful obedience and seeking God's direction empower bold action.

We are often called to obey even when the path is unclear or frightening. Proverbs reminds us to trust the LORD wholeheartedly and submit all our ways to Him. This kind of trust yields guidance, even in complex situations. Similarly, Hebrews affirms the confidence believers can have when God is their helper—fear loses its power.

Consider areas where God is asking you to obey despite uncertainty. Like Esther, fasting, prayer, and submission prepare us to respond in courage anchored by God's wisdom and strength.

# Devotional: Courage Strengthened by Prayer & Fellowship

Esther's call for all the Jews in Susa to fast and pray together reveals the vital role of prayer and community in sustaining courage. Facing overwhelming opposition, she did not rely on her strength alone but enlisted the support and faith of others, demonstrating humility and dependence on God and His people.

Prayer connects us to God's power, while community offers encouragement and shared strength. James assures us that the prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective, and Ecclesiastes highlights the benefit of shared effort. Together, these truths remind us that courageous living is not a solitary endeavor—it flourishes in the context of prayerful fellowship.

Reflect on the communities that support your faith journey and how collective prayer enhances courage. What can you contribute to others' courage through shared faith and support?

#### Your Verse

Esther 5:1 - On the third day Esther put on her royal robes and stood in the inner court of the palace, in front of the king's hall.

- 2 Timothy 1:7 For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.
- Psalm 56:3 When I am afraid, I put my trust in you.







Day 4: 🔀 Courage in the Face of Danger

#### Devotional: Choosing Courage Despite Fear

Esther's moment of stepping unbidden before the king was a decisive act of courage in the face of possible death. Yet her faith allowed her to overcome fear and embrace the call to risk all for the sake of her people. This powerful scene teaches us that courage is a choice — one we make even when fear is present.

God's Spirit equips us with power, love, and self-discipline, not timidity. Paul reminds Timothy that courage comes from the Spirit dwelling within us. Similarly, the Psalmist shows that when fear threatens, placing trust in God anchors us.

Consider what fears hold you back and how the Spirit invites you to move forward. Courage does not mean absence of fear but choosing to trust God and act anyway.
