Stephen's prayer for his persecutors exemplifies Christlike love. Forgiving and praying for enemies reflects the transforming nature of the gospel. It is not easy but it is essential to true discipleship.

Jesus calls us to break cycles of hate through prayer and love. Are you holding on to grudges or resentment? Stephen challenges us to release those bonds and pray for those who oppose us, releasing God's grace for both them and ourselves.
