#### Devotional: Access Granted: God's Presence is Open

The tearing of the temple curtain at Jesus' death is one of the most profound symbols in Scripture. This curtain had separated the Holy of Holies—the presence of God—from the people.

Its tearing signals that Jesus' death opened the way for all people to approach God directly. No longer was access restricted by the old covenant's sacrificial system; through Jesus, we have direct access to the Father.

This moment transforms our understanding of intimacy with God. We are no longer outsiders but beloved children invited into His very presence. Reflect on what it means for your spiritual life to have this continuous access to God.

#### Devotional: Creation Trembles at the Cross

When the rocks split at Jesus' death, it illustrated that creation itself was upheaved. The very earth recognized the significance of the crucifixion. This cosmic disturbance reveals that Jesus' death affects all of creation, not just humanity.

The splitting rocks point to upheaval against the powers of sin, evil, and death that held creation captive. They remind us that the redemption Jesus offers is cosmic in scope—restoring and renewing all things.

Reflect on how God's salvation plan reaches beyond you and me. How does this change your view of the world and your role within it?
