Devotional: Leadership Begins with Godly Character

The elder's role begins with God calling men to lead by example, a high and noble task. 1 Timothy 3:1–7 outlines the character qualifications elders must possess. This passage reminds us that an elder's influence flows from integrity, faithfulness in relationships, and a controlled life. Spiritual leadership is not about status, but about embodying Christlike qualities.

In Titus 1:6, Paul specifically points out the importance of an elder's household as a testimony to his character. The family is often the first proving ground of spiritual leadership and discipline. Leaders must demonstrate holiness and responsibility that inspire the church community.

Lastly, 1 Peter 5 exhorts elders to shepherd the flock eagerly and voluntarily, not reluctantly. This shepherding reflects the heart of God for His people.

This foundational day reminds us that elders lead best when their lives align with the gospel, setting the pace for others to follow in prayer, holiness, and leadership.

Devotional: Prayer: The Elder's Foundation

Elders are called first and foremost to be men of prayer. Acts 6:4 highlights the priority the early church gave to prayer and the ministry of the word. For elders, prayer is not an afterthought but the foundation of leadership.

Paul's directive to "pray continually" in 1 Thessalonians encourages elders to maintain constant communication with God. This ongoing prayerfulness sustains leaders in difficult situations, provides wisdom, and aligns their will with God's purposes.

James 5 reminds believers that the prayers of righteous men – elders included – hold great power and effect. When elders lead in prayer, they intercede for the church's protection, growth, and spiritual health.

Today's devotional challenges elder men to evaluate their prayer life. Is prayer a daily priority that shapes decisions and ministries? Modeling a vibrant prayer life equips the church to trust God's guidance and power through its leaders.

Devotional: Holiness: The Heart of Leadership

Holiness is critical for elders who represent God's standards to the church. 1 Peter 1:15–16 commands believers, especially leaders, to be holy in all aspects of life because God Himself is holy. Elders cannot compartmentalize holiness;

it must permeate all actions, words, and attitudes.

Hebrews 12:14 urges believers to pursue peace and holiness diligently. Elders are called to be peace-makers within their congregations, embodying Christ's purity as a witness to the world.

Romans 12 adds that holiness is our true act of worship—offering our whole selves as holy sacrifices. This comprehensive commitment challenges elders to guard against complacency and temptation.

By modeling holiness, elders provide a tangible example for others to emulate, reinforcing the church's call to transformation and spiritual maturity.

Your Verse

James 3:17 - "But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 11:2 "When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom."
- Philippians 2:3-4 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."







Day 4: ① Leading with Wisdom and Humility

Devotional: Wisdom Rooted in Humility

Leadership in the church demands godly wisdom and humble hearts. James 3:17 describes heavenly wisdom as pure, peace-loving, considerate, submissive, merciful, and sincere. Elders ruling the church must exemplify these qualities to lead effectively and honorably.

Proverbs teaches a direct link between humility and wisdom, warning of the downfall pride brings. Leaders who cling to pride risk damaging relationships and losing influence.

Paul's encouragement to value others above ourselves in Philippians 2 further paints a picture of servant leadership—key for elders shepherding God's flock.

Today challenges elder men to seek wisdom that flows from God and leadership marked by humility, putting others' needs before personal ambition.

Day 5: W Shepherding God's Flock

Devotional: Shepherding With Willing Hearts

Elders serve as shepherds entrusted with caring deeply for God's people. 1 Peter 5:2 urges shepherds to serve willingly and eagerly, not out of compulsion or for personal gain.

Jesus' instruction in John 21 to Peter to "take care of my sheep" underscores the sacredness of spiritual oversight. Eldership includes nurturing, protecting, and guiding the flock toward spiritual maturity.

Paul's words in Ephesians 4 affirm that elders equip believers for service, promoting unity and growth in the body.

Shepherding demands love, patience, and vigilance. It's a holy calling to watch over others and lead toward Christ.

Devotional: Persevering to the End
