Devotional: Wisdom Begins with Reverence for God

Wisdom does not start with cleverness or experience, but with the fear of the Lord. This fear is not terror but a deep reverence and awe for God's holiness and majesty. It acknowledges God's authority over all creation and our humble place before Him.

Proverbs 9:10 calls the fear of the Lord "the beginning of wisdom." This phrase reminds us that all true understanding flows out of a right relationship with God. Without fearing God, our thinking is limited by pride or ignorance.

When we fear the Lord, we open ourselves to receive this wisdom. We recognize that true life and blessings come from God's truth, not simply our own understanding. This passage invites us to treasure wisdom as precious and to pursue it daily.

Ask God to help you seek wisdom above all else today. Remember that every wise decision brings you closer to abundant, fruitful living that honors God and benefits others.

Devotional: God's Wisdom Lights Our Life's Journey
