Day 1: 6 God's Covenant Begins









Your Verse

Genesis 15:1 - "After this, the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision: 'Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your very great reward.'"

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 6:13 "When God made his promise to Abraham, since there was no one greater for him to swear by, he swore by himself."
- Psalm 89:34 "I will not violate my covenant or alter what my lips have uttered."







Devotional: God's Promise Begins With Protection

Genesis 15 opens with God speaking to Abram, establishing a new covenant relationship. Genesis 15:17 – "When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, a smoking firepot with a blazing torch appeared and passed between the pieces."

- Isaiah 6:6 "One of the seraphim...with a live coal in his hand...touched my mouth and said: 'See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."







Devotional: God's Holy Presence in Fire

The mysterious imagery of the smoking firepot and blazing torch is deeply symbolic. In the ancient Near East, fire often represented God's holy presence. Here, the firepot and torch move between the animal pieces Abram set out — a visual confirmation that God Himself is establishing and binding this covenant.

This divine fire not only confirms the commitment but also symbolizes purity, judgment, and presence. God's appearance in this fiery form echoes throughout Scripture as a sign of His holiness — a fire that consumes sin but provides guidance and illumination.

Reflect on the significance of God's presence 'passing between' the pieces alone, indicating that He alone will fulfill the promise. His covenant is sure, not dependent on human action but on His holy and faithful character.

Devotional: Faith and God's Covenant Initiative

The act of cutting the animals and arranging their halves symbolizes the solemnity and seriousness of the covenant God made with Abram. Ancient covenants often included this ritual, emphasizing mutual commitment and consequences.

Interestingly, only God passes through the pieces, signifying it is He who binds Himself to fulfill His promise, not Abram. This divine initiative reveals God's grace and sovereignty. Abram's faith stands firm despite uncertainties, demonstrating that covenant relationship is built on trust rather than works.

Today, consider your commitment to God's covenant and how faith plays a role in your relationship with Him. How can acknowledging God's initiative in your life deepen your devotion and obedience?
