### Devotional: Beginning with Joyful Praise

# Devotional: God Satisfies the Hungry, Challenges the Wealthy

Mary proclaims God's reversal of worldly values, where the hungry are filled and the rich sent away empty. This statement challenges the societal status quo and highlights God's concern for the vulnerable and poor.

In the Gospels, Jesus consistently demonstrates this principle through feeding the hungry, lifting up the downtrodden, and warning against greed. The spiritual hunger for righteousness, justice, and mercy receives a rich reward in God's Kingdom.
