Then, Jesus appears, directing them to cast their nets again. The miraculous catch of fish symbolizes abundance, divine provision, and a fresh start.

Throughout this week, we'll explore key themes such as trust, obedience, restoration, and mission. You will be invited to reflect deeply on how Jesus reaches out to us in our daily lives, renews our calling despite past failures, and lovingly provides for our needs. Whether you feel spiritually dry, uncertain about your purpose, or in need of reassurance of God's active presence, this study will encourage and strengthen you.

Let us embark on this journey together, opening our hearts to the living Christ who calls us to follow Him anew and cares for us every step of the way.

























Your Verse

John 21:1 - "Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee."

Supporting Scriptures

- Luke 24:36–38 "Jesus himself stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.'"
- Mark 16:14 "Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe."







Devotional: Recognizing Jesus in the Ordinary Moments

After Jesus' resurrection, His followers were confused and grieving. Yet, Jesus chose an ordinary setting—a simple shore and a fishing activity—to reveal Himself. This encounter reminds us that God meets us in the everyday. Sometimes, when we feel lost or discouraged, it's easy to miss Jesus' presence. But He is there, patiently waiting for us to recognize Him.

John specifically highlights that Jesus appears by the Sea of Galilee, a familiar place to the disciples. This ordinary locale becomes the stage of a divine revelation. How often do we expect God only in special events, when He is actually working behind the scenes in our routines? Our daily life can become a sacred space if we stay attentive.

As you reflect today, seek to notice Jesus in the simple activities and moments around you. Open your eyes and heart to His presence, especially when life feels uncertain.

Your Verse

John 21:3 - "Simon Peter said, 'I'm going out to fish,' and they said, 'We'll go with you.'"

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 14:28–31 Peter walks on water but begins to sink when doubt overcomes him.
- Psalm 42:5 'Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me?'







Devotional: Feeling Lost and Seeking Direction

After Jesus' crucifixion, the disciples returned to what they knew—fishing—but caught nothing. Their hearts were likely heavy with confusion, disappointment, and uncertainty about their future. Like the disciples, we often revert to familiar patterns when life feels overwhelming or when God's plans seem unclear. Peter's decision to fish again reveals a human struggle to find meaning and direction after trauma or loss.

This struggle is normal; the disciples' apparent failure sets the stage for Jesus' miraculous intervention. It encourages us in our low moments to keep moving forward, even if we don't yet see results. Our efforts are never wasted when done with open hearts toward God's guidance.

Consider your own struggles and moments of feeling stuck. Jesus is inviting you to trust Him, even before the breakthrough.

Give me courage to obey Your direction, even when I can't see the full path. Renew my hope and keep my heart open to Your plans. *Thank You that You never abandon us.* Amen.

Your Verse

- Isaiah 55:1 'Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters.'
- Revelation 3:20 'Here I am! I stand at the door and knock.'







Day 3: A Jesus' Tender Invitation

Devotional: Obedience Unlocks Abundance

Jesus gently instructs the disciples to cast their nets on the right side, leading to a miraculous catch. The invitation is tender, yet powerful—obedience brings blessing. This teaches us about the blessings that stem from trusting Jesus' guidance, even when it seems counterintuitive or when past efforts have failed.

Our obedience is a step of faith. Sometimes God's directions don't align with our plans or understanding. Yet He knows what we need and how to provide in abundance. When we yield to His voice, it can result in surprising and joyous breakthroughs.

Today, reflect on areas where Jesus may be prompting you to act differently or to trust Him more fully. How can you respond in obedience to unlock the blessings He desires to pour out in your life?

John 21:12–13 – "Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples dared ask him, 'Who are you?' They knew it was the Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 14:19 Jesus feeds the 5,000 with loaves and fishes.
- Psalm 23:5 'You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies.'







Devotional: Nourishment for Body and Soul

After the miraculous catch, Jesus shares a meal with the disciples, demonstrating His care for both their physical and spiritual needs. This act of feeding highlights God's holistic provision: He cares deeply about every aspect of our lives.

In our fast-paced world, we often neglect times of rest and nourishment. Jesus reminds us to pause and receive His sustenance. Sharing a meal fosters relationship and renewal, symbolizing fellowship with Him and others.

Consider what 'feeding' you need today—whether physical rest, spiritual renewal, or purposeful connection with Jesus and community.

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 16:18-19 Jesus gives Peter the keys of the kingdom.
- 1 Peter 5:2 'Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care.'







Devotional: Restoring Purpose and Mission

In this pivotal moment, Jesus restores Peter after his earlier denial and reaffirms his purpose by commissioning him to 'feed my lambs.' Jesus offers grace and renewal, not condemnation, even when we fail. This call invites us to embrace God's mission despite our imperfections.

Peter's restoration shows how Christ's love heals and empowers us to move forward. Our failures don't disqualify us; rather, they deepen our dependence on His strength. Jesus asks us to care for others, to lead with compassion, and to participate in His redemptive work.

Reflect on your own calling and how Jesus is inviting you to recommit to His mission today.

The charcoal fire with fish and bread symbolizes Jesus' tender provision and ongoing care for His disciples. Even after resurrection, Jesus continues to provide comfort and sustenance, showing that He knows and meets our needs.

This image reminds us that God doesn't just save us once but walks with us daily, providing what we need physically, emotionally, and spiritually. His care is consistent and personal.

Think about how God has provided in your life recently and how that encourages trust in His faithfulness.

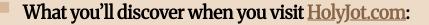
