Introduction

Welcome to this three-day study on humility as taught in the Gospels, centered on Luke 14:7—11. The Gospels are rich with Jesus' teachings and stories that reveal God's kingdom values, often standing in contrast to worldly pride and ambition. One of the most powerful lessons is found in Jesus' invitation to humble ourselves, especially seen in His parable about the guest who chooses the lowest seat at a feast and is then exalted by the host.

In Luke 14:7—11, Jesus challenges guests to consider their place — not to seek the place of honor but to embrace humility, trusting God to lift them up in His perfect timing. This principle not only shapes our attitude toward God's kingdom but also radically influences how we relate to others. Humility isn't about thinking less of ourselves but thinking of ourselves less, allowing God's grace to work through us.

Over the next three days, we will explore this beautiful teaching on humility, examine supporting passages from the Gospels, and reflect on practical ways to live humbly in a world that often celebrates self-exaltation. As you study these passages, may you find inspiration to approach life and relationships with the humble heart Jesus desires.

Let's dive into the heart of God's kingdom where the last are first, and the humble are exalted.







Day 1: Seeing True Honor in God's Kingdom









Day 1: Q Seeing True Honor in God's Kingdom

Your Verse

Luke 14:7—11 NIV - Jesus invites guests to choose the lowest seat to be exalted.

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 23:12 'For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.'
- James 4:10 'Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up.'







Day 1: Q Seeing True Honor in God's Kingdom

Devotional: Embracing Honor Through Humility

Understanding humility begins with recognizing where true honor comes from. In Luke 14:7–11, Jesus tells a story about a wedding feast, where guests are eager to sit in the place of prominence. However, Jesus advises taking the lowest seat, because the host will then invite the guest to move up, resulting in honor. This teaches us that God's definition of honor is different from the world's shallow view.

Humility acknowledges God as the giver of all status and grace. When we compete for attention or status, we risk pride, which separates us from God's favor. Jesus reminds us that trusting God's timing and sovereignty brings true exaltation. This is a call to trust Him, surrender self–promotion, and embrace a lowly posture in relationships and community.

Think of humility not as weakness but as strength under control — strength that trusts God's justice and timing rather than seeking immediate recognition. It's an invitation to live with openness, grace, and patience in a world that demands quick self-glorification.

John 13:12—17 NIV - Jesus washes His disciples' feet as an example of humility.

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 2:5–8 Christ's humility leads Him to serve others and obey to death.
- Mark 10:43-45 'Whoever wants to be great must be a servant.'







Devotional: Following Jesus' Example of Humble Service

Jesus' actions toward His disciples reveal the heart of true humility. In John 13, He kneels to wash their dusty feet — a task reserved for servants. This shocking reversal of roles embodies the very essence of humility: putting others' needs before one's own status or comfort.

Jesus didn't humiliate Himself for pride or showmanship, but to teach a vital principle: *God's kingdom values are upside-down compared to the world's.* True greatness is found in serving, and this path requires a humble, loving heart. By following Jesus' example, we partake in a humble lifestyle that sacrifices our own agendas for others' well-being.

What might it look like to serve without seeking recognition or reward? Embracing humility as Jesus did involves regular self-examination and willingness to set aside ego and entitlement. It opens us to deeper fellowship with God and others, and it prepares us for the exaltation God promises.

1.	How do I respond when called to serve in unnoticed or difficult ways?
2.	What prideful attitudes might hinder me from serving like Jesus?
3.	In what ways can I imitate Jesus' servant-heart daily?

1.	Describe a recent opportunity where you served humbly and how it felt.
2.	Write about how Jesus' example challenges your view of greatness.
3.	Identify practical ways you can serve others this week without expecting praise.







Prayer for Today

Gracious Lord, You humbled Yourself to serve and love. Help me to adopt Your servant's heart and to serve others selflessly. Strip away any pride that blinds me from living humbly. Teach me to find joy in small acts of love and obedience, just as You did. May my life reflect Your grace and humility to everyone I meet.

Day 3: 🎇 Trusting God's Promise of Exaltation

Your Verse

Luke 18:9—14 NIV - The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector highlights humility before God.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 5:6 'Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.'
- Proverbs 3:34 'He mocks proud mockers but shows favor to the humble and oppressed.'







Day 3: X Trusting God's Promise of Exaltation

Devotional: Living in Confidence of God's Exaltation

Humility ultimately trusts God's promise to exalt in His time. The parable in Luke 18 contrasts the proud Pharisee and the humble tax collector. The tax collector's humble plea for mercy reflects a heart aligned with God's ways, which Jesus commends. He who exalts himself falls, but he who humbles himself is lifted up.

This teaches us to release control and cease self-justification, trusting God's justice and love. Humility is more than an action; it is a posture of dependence on God. When we humble ourselves, acknowledging our need for His mercy, we align ourselves with His kingdom's values and promises.

Today, reflect on God's faithfulness to exalt those who humble themselves. The world may reward pride, but God's kingdom honors humility above all. Let us bow before Him with sincere hearts, confident in His timing and goodness.
