His background was deeply rooted in Pharisaic tradition and Jewish law, which he upheld with fervor. This zeal, however, was misdirected and blinded to the truth of Jesus as the Messiah.

This intensity shows us how easy it can be to pursue good things with the wrong assumptions. Paul's story reminds us that religious passion without truth leads to destruction, but God's grace can redirect and transform such passion for His glory.

As you begin this study, consider God's ability to use your past—even mistakes and misguided zeal—for His purposes. Let Paul's story encourage you to remain open to God's transformative work in your life.

This encounter reminds us that no one is beyond the reach of God's saving grace. Paul's immediate obedience—being baptized and filling with the Spirit—shows the power of surrendering to Christ.


