#### Your Verse

#### Devotional: Finding Divine Peace Beyond Anxiety

### Devotional: Rooted Strength from God's Presence

When entangled in narcissistic chaos, women can feel frail and vulnerable.

Yet the Bible reminds us that God dwells within us; we do not walk alone. Psalm 46:5 boldly states, "God is within her, she will not fall." This assurance offers unshakable strength even when external circumstances seem to threaten our soul.

True strength is not merely physical or emotional—it is the power to stand firm because your identity is found in God's presence. Proverbs 31 describes a woman clothed in strength and dignity who laughs without fear of the future. This is strength overflowing from trust in God rather than self-reliance.

In difficult encounters, remember Isaiah 41:10's promise that God is with you; do not fear or be dismayed. Lean into His encouragement. God's strength enables you to set healthy boundaries and respond wisely rather than react emotionally.

### Devotional: Guarding Your Heart God's Way

Living free from narcissistic control requires healthy boundaries. Proverbs 4:23 urges us to guard our hearts because from our inner world flows our entire life.

Boundaries protect not just feelings but our spiritual well-being. Jesus teaches clear communication in Matthew 5:37: simple, honest 'Yes' and 'No' responses. This clarity cuts through manipulation and deceit that often fuel narcissistic chaos.

However, boundaries are not a license to isolate. Galatians 6:2 calls us to carry each other's burdens, showing love balanced with wisdom.

Setting boundaries is an act of self-respect and obedience to God, allowing space to heal and flourish. It helps distinguish harmful behavior from genuine care. Through prayer and discernment, ask God for wisdom to define these limits and the courage to hold firm.
