# Devotional: Discipline Builds Strength and Perseverance

Day 3: Frowing Spiritually Through God's Discipline

#### Devotional: Blessed by God's Loving Discipline

God's discipline is a sign of His love and care for us. Psalm 94:12 calls us blessed when disciplined and taught by God's law. It is His way of shaping us into vessels fit for His glory. Sometimes discipline can feel challenging or painful, but Scripture tells us it springs from God's heart.

Proverbs 3 teaches that discipline should not be despised or resented because it evidences love. Repentance and earnestness in responding to correction open doors to deeper spiritual growth. Revelation reminds us that God's rebukes are for restoration and are given with love.

Allow yourself to receive God's discipline today as a blessing rather than a burden. Growth requires pruning and correction. When we cooperate with God's shaping hand, our faith matures, bearing lasting fruit. Consider how you might respond differently to God's discipline in daily life—welcoming it as a precious gift for your spiritual well-being.
