#### Your Verse

Ephesians 4:31–32 – "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







#### Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness Over Bitterness

**Bitterness** can quietly invade our hearts, especially when we've been hurt by others. It weighs us down and hinders our relationship with God and others. But Scripture calls us to a different path—one of forgiveness that brings freedom.

In Ephesians 4:31–32, Paul urges believers to let go of bitterness and instead be kind and compassionate, forgiving just as God forgave us through Christ. Forgiveness is not simply forgetting or pretending the hurt didn't happen; rather, it is a deliberate choice to release bitterness and surrender the desire for revenge.

By forgiving, we imitate God's grace and open our hearts for healing. It's important to recognize that forgiveness benefits us as much as those who wronged us, breathing new life into weary souls.

**Today, ask yourself:** What bitterness am I holding onto? How might choosing forgiveness open the door to peace and healing?

Day 2: V Forgiveness with Healthy Boundaries

#### Devotional: Guarding Your Heart While Forgiving

**Forgiveness** does not mean allowing others to continue harming or manipulating us. God calls us to guard our hearts carefully, creating healthy boundaries that protect our well-being.

Proverbs 4:23 reminds us to "above all else" keep watch over what influences our hearts, because our actions and emotions flow from there. Forgiving someone frees you from bitterness, but it doesn't require becoming vulnerable to repeated hurt.

Jesus teaches us to be wise as serpents and innocent as doves—this means being discerning about who we trust and how we let relationships affect us. Sometimes, loving others includes saying no and balancing support with self-care, as Paul explains in Galatians about carrying burdens and also carrying our own load.

Setting boundaries is an act of self-respect and wisdom, not selfishness. It's an essential companion to forgiveness, ensuring you don't lose yourself in the process.

Reflect on where God might be asking you to set boundaries as you forgive.

#### Devotional: God's Healing in Our Forgiveness Journey

Forgiveness opens the door for **God's healing** to flow into places where we have been broken and wounded. Psalm 147:3 assures us that God actively binds up broken hearts—He longs to restore what has been damaged by pain and betrayal.

Forgiving does not instantly erase hurt, but it invites God's healing power to transform wounds into new life. Isaiah 61 describes the Messiah's mission to proclaim freedom and healing, an ongoing work in us as we release bitterness.

When we forgive, we partner with God's restorative work in our lives, letting Him mend and renew our hearts. Prayer is a vital part of this journey — James 5 reminds us that honest, heartfelt prayer brings powerful healing.

**Embrace today as a day of healing and restoration.** Invite God into your pain and watch His grace renew your spirit.

#### Devotional: Choosing Grace and Love Over Bitterness

**Bitterness** can often start small, like a root that grows unnoticed, but if left unchecked it spreads damage in our hearts and relationships. Hebrews 12:15 warns against this, encouraging us to embrace God's grace to prevent bitterness from taking hold.

Every day, we face situations and people that could provoke anger or resentment. Romans 12 reminds us to resist the urge for revenge and trust God's justice. Choosing forgiveness becomes a daily decision to let go, even when circumstances feel unfair.

Jesus challenges us further in Luke to love our enemies and do good to those who hurt us. This is difficult but transformative, breaking the cycle of bitterness and fostering peace within.

**Practice daily grace** by inviting the Holy Spirit to remind you to forgive and love, replacing bitterness with light and hope.

#### Devotional: Embracing God's Strength in Weakness

Forgiving often involves **vulnerability**: admitting pain, leaning on God, and sometimes feeling weak. Yet Scripture reveals that God's power shines brightest in our weakness.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12:9 remind us that God's grace is enough, and His power is made perfect in our moments of struggle. We do not have to be strong alone; God carries us through.

When your heart feels crushed or vulnerable, Psalm 34:18 assures you that God is close, tenderly saving and comforting you. And when uncertainty arises about how to forgive or set boundaries, James 1:5 invites you to ask God for wisdom—as He generously gives.

Allow yourself to be vulnerable before God today, knowing it is a pathway to true strength through His Spirit.

#### Devotional: Inspiration from Women Who Forgave

The Bible is rich with examples of women who embodied forgiveness and courage. In Luke 7, the woman who anointed Jesus shows deep love born from great forgiveness—her acts demonstrate how forgiveness transforms the heart.

Joseph's story (Genesis 50:20) also exemplifies forgiveness and divine purpose, reminding us that God can use even painful experiences for good. The faithfulness of Ruth highlights commitment and love amid uncertainty and difficulty.

These stories inspire us to trust God's plan, forgive, and love without losing ourselves. They reflect the strength and grace God provides for women facing complex emotional journeys.
