#### Devotional: God's Sovereignty Over Earthly Powers

The opening of the plagues narrative sets the stage for God's declaration of sovereignty. God appoints Moses as His representative, stating, 'I have made you like God to Pharaoh.' This striking phrase shows God's authority vested in Moses, preparing him to confront Pharaoh and the gods of Egypt.

God's sovereignty means He controls all things, including the hearts of kings and nations. Even Pharaoh, powerful as he is, will be shown to be under God's ultimate authority. This realization should inspire confidence in God's plans and timing.

This plague reveals that no physical element or idol can withstand God's will. It confronts us, too, with the reality of false reliance. Are we placing trust in anything more than God?

God's judgment here also gives room for repentance; the timing is deliberate and merciful. If Egypt had turned to God, the devastation could have been avoided. Yet, Pharaoh's heart hardened, prolonging their suffering.

Let this plague remind you to evaluate what you trust and cherish most. God calls us to worship Him alone and recognize His true power over all creation.

This plague teaches us how God can humble prideful nations and expose the futility of false gods. Sometimes, God's actions may seem inconvenient or disruptive, but they serve a higher purpose in calling people to Himself.

Pharaoh's delayed response shows human stubbornness in the face of divine correction. The plague was not just a curse but an intended invitation to repentance.

Consider areas in your life where God may be drawing your attention through discomfort or challenge. Are you open to His correction, or do you resist like Pharaoh?

The third plague, gnats from the dust, seemed small yet was highly irritating and unignorable. This plague shows that no part of creation is outside God's authority—even the dust and smallest creatures serve His purposes.

God begins to demonstrate that even what seems insignificant under His control can be used to accomplish His will. Through the gnats, God humbles Pharaoh's magicians, who could not replicate this plague and declared, 'This is the finger of God.'

The plague also symbolizes how God can use humble means to accomplish great ends. It challenges human pride and false authority, pointing to the power of God's 'finger'—a metaphor for His direct intervention.

Reflect on how God might be using small or unexpected things in your life right now to work His plan.

God's hand is clear in this judgment: He holds the power to sanctify and to bring judgment. Flies were detested and related to deities of creation and fertility, again showing that these gods were powerless against Yahweh.

Despite the visible devastation, Pharaoh's heart remains calloused, highlighting how hardness of heart resists recognizing God's authority.

This plague invites us to examine our own spiritual sensitivity. Are there areas where repeated warnings and consequences have not yet led to repentance?

God's judgment is purposeful, meant to refine and bring awareness.

Despite suffering, Pharaoh's heart remained unyielded, showcasing the severity of spiritual blindness and rebellion.

This calls us to consider how we respond to God's refining work—whether through discomfort, discipline, or trial. Do we resist or embrace God's loving correction?
