Devotional: Peace Is the Path to Joy

Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, called peacemakers "blessed" — a title reserved for those who live in alignment with God's heart. Yet, the joy and favor that come with this pursuit far outweigh temporary victories won through conflict.

Devotional: Stop the Flood Before It Starts

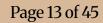

Devotional: The Courage to Reconcile

Devotional: Godly Wisdom Bears Peace
