### Devotional: Honest Prayer: Bringing Pain Before God

#### Your Verse

Psalm 6:2 – "Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am faint; heal me, Lord, for my bones are in agony."

### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Micah 7:18 "Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance?"
- Psalm 51:1 "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions."







Day 2: W Asking for Mercy

### Devotional: Seeking God's Compassion and Healing

In the midst of suffering, the psalmist boldly asks God for mercy and healing, recognizing his weakness and desperate need. Mercy reflects God's compassion and willingness to forgive and restore us despite our frailty and failures.

- Exodus 34:6 "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness."
