Devotional: The Boldness to Speak God's Truth

How do we respond when called to proclaim truth? Micaiah's willingness to say exactly what God revealed, even when it opposed the majority, shows extraordinary faith and obedience. This day challenges us to consider our own readiness to speak God's truth — even if doing so feels risky or unpopular. God's word requires boldness, not timidity, and Micaiah provides a clear example of divine courage.

It is easy to blend in with crowds or echo popular opinions, but God calls us to *stand on His word*. The truth may be uncomfortable or difficult to hear, but it is always life-giving. When we proclaim truth as Micaiah did, we participate in God's redemptive plan to guide others into freedom.

Devotional: Cultivating the Habit of Listening to God

Often, our challenge is not only to talk about truth but to be so closely connected with God that we hear Him clearly.
