#### Devotional: The Power of Reverent Fear of God

## Devotional: Steadfast Trust Builds Eternal Security

The final verses of Psalm 112 portray a life anchored in God's righteousness as stable and unshakable. The righteous person is not immune to difficulties or bad news but possesses a steadfast heart that trusts in the Lord. This deep trust results in peace amid turmoil and security despite uncertainty.

Psalm 112 teaches that those who live righteously enjoy lasting remembrance and leave a legacy that honors God. This eternal perspective transforms how we approach daily trials because our hope is fixed on God, who sustains us and ultimately rewards faithfulness.

How does trusting God help you face fear and uncertainty? Isaiah 26:3 assures us of perfect peace when our minds are focused on God. Meanwhile, Paul's words in 2 Timothy remind us that a faithful life leads to a glorious reward beyond this life—a crown of righteousness.

As you walk in God's righteousness, remember that your life is secure in Him, and your legacy will echo into eternity.
