Devotional: Listening for God's Unexpected Call

God often calls us in ways we don't anticipate. Ananias was just going about his life in Damascus when God called him specifically by name. This teaches us that God knows us intimately and has unique purposes for each of us.

When God calls, it may come as a surprise or lead us into uncomfortable territory. Just like Ananias, we might question, *Why me? How can I do this?* But God's call carries power and purpose beyond our understanding. His invitation to obedience is an opportunity to trust Him and be part of His redemptive work in the world.

Today, listen for God's voice and be open to the unexpected ways He might be leading you.

Devotional: Courage to Obey with Faith Over Fear

Obedience sometimes demands courage above comfort. Ananias knew Saul's reputation as a fierce persecutor. Following God's command meant confronting fear and danger. Yet, God's reassurance was clear: Saul was His chosen instrument for ministry.

This teaches us that God's purposes are often greater than our fears. Faith doesn't mean absence of fear; it means trusting God despite it. We serve a God who equips us with power and love, enabling us to step forward boldly.

As you consider the areas in your life where fear holds you back, remember Ananias' example of faith-filled obedience. Let God's Spirit empower you to act.

Devotional: Trusting God's Purpose Beyond Suffering

God's plans often involve challenges and suffering, but they lead to greater good. Ananias was told to minister to Saul, who was destined to suffer for the gospel—a difficult path. Yet this suffering was purposeful, refining Paul's faith and impact.

Sometimes, obedience to God's call means accepting discomfort or hardship now for eternal rewards later. Trusting God means *seeing beyond the present* and believing that He works all things for good, even when we don't understand.

In trials, God's grace sustains us, making us stronger and better equipped for His purposes.
