Devotional: Humble Leadership Reflects Christ's Example

Leadership in marriage is often misunderstood as authority or control, but Scripture reveals a very different picture. The husband as head is modeled after Christ's headship over the Church—which is marked by sacrificial love and humility. Jesus leads by serving rather than dominating.
