#### Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day journey focused on the Seventy Sent Out Two by Two. In Luke 10, Jesus appoints seventy disciples and sends them ahead of Him to every town and place He Himself planned to visit. This passage reveals powerful lessons on mission, obedience, reliance on God, and the urgency of sharing the Good News.

The story of the seventy is a blueprint for Christian mission today. Jesus doesn't just send them; He equips them, instructs them, and empowers them for this task. They are sent in pairs, underscoring the importance of partnership and encouragement in ministry. They are given authority over unclean spirits and heal the sick as signs of God's Kingdom breaking through.

Over the next seven days, we will dive deep into this passage and its surrounding texts. We will discover the heart of Jesus for the lost, the role of dependence on the Holy Spirit, and the transformational power that unfolds when followers obey His call. Whether you feel called to share your faith, serve in your community, or simply gain a deeper understanding of mission, this study will inspire and challenge you.

This plan encourages you to reflect, journal, and pray intentionally, opening your heart to God's purposes. May you gain renewed vision and courage to participate in the Great Commission, experiencing firsthand the joy and authority Jesus extends to His followers. Let's embark on this exciting journey of obedience, faith, and empowerment together!

Day 1: 🔥 Called and Sent: Understanding Jesus' Mission

#### Devotional: Called to Go Two by Two

Jesus calls and sends. In Luke 10:1, we see a deliberate and purposeful sending of seventy-two disciples. This isn't a random act but a strategic mission. Jesus knows the areas He plans to visit and dispatches these followers ahead of Him, preparing the spiritual ground. This reveals that mission work is not improvisation—it requires preparation, intentionality, and faith in God's plan.

Just as Jesus sent the seventy-two, He calls each believer today to be witnesses in their communities. This calling requires obedience and trust, knowing that Jesus goes before us. The two-by-two sending highlights partnership — none of us are meant to serve alone. *God uses relationships to strengthen and sustain us on the mission field.* 

**Reflection:** Do you sense a calling from Jesus to step out in faith? Who can you partner with to encourage and support your walk? Begin this journey trusting that Jesus equips and empowers you for His purposes.

Day 2: Empowered by the Spirit for Mission

#### Devotional: God's Power Works Through Us

The power to overcome comes from God. The seventy returned excited because even unclean spirits obeyed them in Jesus' name. This power was not their own; it came as a result of their obedience and reliance on the Holy Spirit. When Jesus sends His followers, He equips them with authority and power beyond their own abilities.

We are not left on our own to battle the forces of darkness or to influence the world for Christ. The Spirit empowers us to speak boldly, to heal, and to proclaim the Kingdom. This reminder gives us courage amid challenges, knowing that God's power works through us.

**Ask yourself:** Are you leaning on the Holy Spirit's power, or are you trying to do ministry in your own strength? Surrender your limitations to God today and embrace His supernatural empowerment for your daily mission.

#### Your Verse

Luke 10:2 — He told them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.'

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Matthew 9:37 The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few.
- Romans 10:14 How can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard?







#### Devotional: Praying for Workers in the Harvest

The harvest is urgent. Jesus' commission reminds us of the vast number of people who need to hear the Gospel. The world's spiritual harvest is plentiful, but there are too few workers. This calls believers to pray consistently for God to send more workers into the harvest field.

This verse also challenges us personally. Are we willing to answer the call? Jesus sends His disciples ahead to prepare the way, trusted to proclaim peace and healing. We are called to this same readiness and willingness to go where He leads.

**Prayer fuels mission.** Before action comes prayer. When we ask God to raise up workers, we are also aligning ourselves with His heart. Reflect today on your willingness to participate in God's harvest and commit to praying for laborers.

2.	How can you be an answer to the prayer for laborers?
3.	In what ways can prayer move you to action?

1.	Write about your feelings when you consider the spiritual needs around you.

3.	Record your prayers asking God to send workers into His harvest fields.

#### Your Verse

Luke 10:5-6 — When you enter a house, first say, 'Peace to this house.' If someone who promotes peace is there, your peace will rest on them; if not, it will return to you.

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Romans 12:18 If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.
- Philippians 4:7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts.







#### Devotional: Carrying God's Peace to Others

Jesus instructs His followers to bring peace. Peace here is more than a greeting; it's a declaration of God's Kingdom presence. When the seventy enter a home, they impart peace and demonstrate God's love and authority. This peace can either rest on those who are receptive or return to the messenger if it's rejected.

Peace is central to our witness. It represents reconciliation, healing, and the hope in Christ. In a world filled with conflict and fear, believers are called to be agents of God's peace—bringing calm, restoration, and love wherever they go.

**Reflect on how you share peace.** Are you aware of the spiritual atmosphere you carry into your daily interactions? Pray for God's peace to flow through you and extend to others even in difficult environments.

1.	How does God's peace manifest in your life and relationships?
2.	Are there places or people where you feel challenged to bring peace?
3.	What does it look like to surrender hostility and be a peacemaker?

1.	Write about a time you experienced God's peace during a difficult situation.

3.	List ways you can cultivate a peacemaking spirit daily.

#### Your Verse

Luke 10:10–11 — But when you enter a town and are not welcomed, shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them.

#### Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 10:14 If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, leave that home or town and shake the dust off your feet.
- 2 Timothy 3:12 In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted.







#### Devotional: Faithful in the Face of Rejection

**Not everyone will receive the message of hope.** Jesus prepares His disciples for rejection and advises a clear response: shake the dust from your feet as a testimony. This symbolic act signifies leaving behind those who reject the Gospel and moving on without bitterness or fear.

Rejection is painful but often inevitable for those who follow Christ faithfully. However, the mission continues. Jesus reminds us to keep our eyes on the greater purpose and not be discouraged by closed doors. Every effort is not about immediate success, but obedience and faithful witness.

**Today, reflect on how you handle rejection.** Are you discouraged or resilient? Trust God to use every moment, accepted or rejected, to advance His Kingdom. Find freedom in releasing what you cannot control.

1.	How do you typically respond to rejection in faith or life?
2.	What can you learn from Jesus' instruction about shaking off rejection?
3.	How does trusting God change your perspective on rejection?







## **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Recall a time you faced rejection and how you responded.
2.	Write a prayer asking God to heal any bitterness or discouragement.
3.	List ways you can remain faithful despite opposition.







#### Prayer for Today

**Lord Jesus,** help me accept rejection without losing heart or hope. Teach me to shake off discouragement and continue faithfully in Your mission. #### Your Verse

Luke 10:17-20 — The seventy-two returned with joy and said, 'Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name!' Jesus replied, 'Be joyful that your names are written in heaven.'

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!
- 1 Thessalonians 5:16–18 Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances.







#### Devotional: Joy Rooted in Salvation

**The mission brings joy.** The seventy returned from their assignment full of excitement over the authority they experienced through Jesus' name. However, Jesus redirected their joy toward a deeper source—their salvation and standing before God.

This teaches us that while ministry successes may bring joy, the greatest cause for rejoicing is the secure relationship we have with God. Our joy is anchored not in what we accomplish but in who we are in Christ.

**Today, celebrate the victories and remember your eternal identity.** Recognize that your name is known in heaven and that your daily faithfulness is forever significant.

1.	Where do you find your deepest joy in your faith journey?
2.	How do you balance celebrating victories with humility?
3.	What does it mean to you that your name is written in heaven?

1.	Write about a moment of joy experienced through serving God.
2.	Reflect on the significance of your salvation and relationship with Jesus.
3.	List ways to cultivate continual joy regardless of circumstances.

# Devotional: Embracing Daily Mission as Christ's Ambassador
