Devotional: Finding Hope in the Midst of Judgment and Chaos

Devotional: The Fig Tree: Judgment with Hope for Renewal

The fig tree carries rich biblical symbolism, often related to Israel's spiritual state—prosperity, fruitfulness, or judgment. In Revelation 6:13, the stars fall like figs shaken from the tree, invoking this imagery much deeper than a simple natural event.

Figs dropping symbolize sudden loss or removal, often associated with judgment due to spiritual barrenness or unfaithfulness. Jesus' curse on the barren fig tree in Matthew 21 serves as a powerful sign of coming judgment against fruitlessness.
