Devotional: The Heart That Loves Correction Grows Stronger

Devotional: God's Favor Follows a Life of Integrity

God honors those who work with integrity. Proverbs 12:2 reminds us that good people—with hearts aligned to Him—receive favor and blessing. This divine favor cultivates success that is lasting and fulfills God's purposes.

Integrity at work transcends mere compliance; it means doing everything wholeheartedly for God's glory, trusting Him to reward our faithfulness. When we avoid schemes and shortcuts, we witness God's hand guiding our efforts to fruitful outcomes.
