Your Verse

Matthew 27:51 – The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom.

- Exodus 26:31 And you shall make a veil of blue and purple and scarlet yarns and fine twined linen.







Devotional: Access Granted: No More Barriers

The torn veil signified the removal of barriers between God and humanity. The curtain in the temple separated the Holy of Holies—the very presence of God—from the people.

When it was torn from top to bottom at Jesus' death, it symbolized that through His sacrifice, access to God was made freely available.

The tearing from top to bottom shows that this act was initiated by God Himself, not human hands, declaring that no separation remains.

This moment ushered in the New Covenant, where believers become priests with direct access to God's presence.

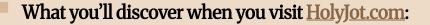




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
