#### Devotional: Recognizing Debt's Spiritual and Emotional Cost

Debt is more than a financial issue; it's a spiritual and emotional weight.

Proverbs 22:7 clearly states that the borrower is a slave to the lender. When we take on debt carelessly, we risk losing control not only over our finances but also over our time, decisions, and freedom.

Romans reminds us that the only debt we should keep is the ongoing obligation to love others. Everything else should be paid off promptly to prevent bondage. ## Devotional: Choosing Contentment Over Debt

God calls us to cultivate contentment as a powerful antidote to the temptation of debt and financial worry. 1 Timothy reminds us that godliness accompanied by contentment is true gain. When we chase wealth or borrow beyond our means, it often stems from a deeper dissatisfaction or misplaced trust.

Hebrews encourages us to keep our lives free from the love of money, recognizing that contentment is grounded in trusting God's provision. *Honoring God with our resources*, as Proverbs teaches, invites His blessing and provision into our lives in unexpected ways.

Stewardship means managing what God entrusts to us wisely — including money. We can resist the desire to overspend or borrow when we live with gratitude, planning carefully and seeking God's wisdom daily.

## Devotional: Plan Wisely to Experience Financial Freedom

God's wisdom teaches us that planning and self-control are vital to living free from debt. Proverbs 21:20 contrasts the wise who save and the foolish who consume recklessly. When we fail to plan or control spending, we become vulnerable to financial slavery and stress.

Jesus encourages us in Luke to count the cost carefully before taking on a commitment. This principle applies well to borrowing and financial decisions — thoughtful planning avoids unnecessary hardship.

Finally, Jesus' words in Matthew remind us of the spiritual danger of divided loyalty. Serving money often leads to debt and bondage, but serving God leads to true freedom. By seeking God's kingdom first and living wisely, we can break free from financial chains and experience abundant life.
