Transformed by Encounter: Lessons from Moses' Radiant Face



Explore how Moses' radiant face after meeting God reveals the transformative power of divine encounters and how God's presence changes us.





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Introduction

The story of Moses' radiant face after meeting with God is one of the most vivid illustrations of transformation found in the Bible. After spending time with the Lord on Mount Sinai, Moses descended with his face shining so brightly that the Israelites were afraid to come near him (Exodus 34:29–35). This radiant glow was not just physical but symbolized the profound impact of encountering God's holiness and glory directly. It reveals how intimate fellowship with God changes us internally and externally.

This Bible study plan invites you to journey through seven days of reflection, focusing on Moses' experience as a lens to understand how God's presence transforms us. Each day uncovers a different facet of this encounter—from the fear it inspired, the renewal it brought, to the call to reflect God's glory in our own lives.

By exploring related Scriptures and engaging with devotional thoughts, we will see how God desires for us to be changed by Him, to shine with His love and truth, and to carry His presence into the world around us. Whether you are new to faith or have walked long with God, the example of Moses challenges us all to meet God with expectancy and be transformed by His glory.

















Your Verse

Exodus 34:29 NIV – "When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 3:18 "And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory."
- Psalm 34:5 "Those who look to him are radiant; their faces are never covered with shame."







Devotional: Radiant Transformation Through Divine Encounter

Moses' radiant face is a striking visual of the transformative power of an encounter with God. After speaking with the Lord, Moses didn't even realize his face was shining. This suggests that real transformation happens internally first. When we spend time with God, absorbing His presence through prayer, worship, and the Word, we begin to reflect His glory outwardly.

But what does it mean to "contemplate the Lord's glory" like it says in 2 Corinthians 3:18? It means to fix our eyes on God's holiness, goodness, and truth in such a way that it changes our attitudes, our actions, and even our countenance. Moses was changed because he drew near to God and sat with Him.

Today, consider how you can cultivate a closer fellowship with God that allows His glory to transform you from the inside out.

Day 2: 6 Fear and Reverence in God's Presence

Your Verse

Exodus 34:30 NIV - "When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 6:5 "Woe to me! I cried. I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips... and I live among a people of unclean lips."
- Hebrews 12:28 "Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe."







Day 2: 6 Fear and Reverence in God's Presence

Devotional: Holy Awe: Embracing Reverence for God

The Israelites were afraid to approach Moses because of his radiant face. This reminds us that God's holiness evokes both awe and fear. It is not casual to be in God's presence, but it is reverent and transformational. When we truly recognize God's majesty, it stirs within us a holy fear — a deep respect that honors Him and acknowledges our own limitations.

Isaiah's reaction to seeing God's glory in the temple (Isaiah 6:5) echoes this same fear and humility. Yet, this fear is not meant to paralyze but to open the door for cleansing and empowerment. Hebrews encourages us to worship God with reverence, knowing the unshakable kingdom He offers.

Reflect on your own response when you consider God's holiness. Are you filled with reverence and awe? How does that shape your relationship with Him?

Day 3: Protection Through God's Glory

Your Verse

Exodus 34:35 NIV - "Whenever Moses entered the tent, he would remove the veil until he came out. And when he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see that his face was radiant."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 91:4 "He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart."
- Isaiah 60:1 "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you."







Day 3: Protection Through God's Glory

Devotional: God's Glory: Shield and Strength

The veil Moses wore when speaking to the Israelites symbolizes the boundary between God's intense glory and human frailty. God's presence is powerful and protecting but also needs to be approached rightly. The radiant face behind the veil showed God's protection and renewal at work in Moses.

Psalm 91 offers a beautiful image of God as a shield and refuge — we are covered and protected when we place our trust in Him. Isaiah's call to 'arise and shine' reminds us that God's glory empowers us to live boldly despite challenges.

Consider how God's glory acts as both protection and empowerment in your life.

Your Verse

Exodus 34:33–34 NIV – "Moses would put the veil over his face again until he went in to speak with the Lord. Then he would come out and tell the Israelites what he had been commanded."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 5:16 "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."
- Philippians 2:15 "...so that you may become blameless and pure, 'children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.' Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky."







Devotional: Shining God's Light to the World

Moses' radiant face was connected to his role as a mediator between God and the people. After receiving God's commands, he removed his veil to share God's words and shine His glory before the Israelites. This teaches us that being transformed by God's presence isn't for selfish display but to benefit others.

Jesus calls us to let our light shine before others, reflecting God's goodness and drawing people toward Him. Paul reminds believers to live blamelessly so that our lives stand out like stars in a dark world.

Ask yourself: How can I reflect God's glory in my relationships, work, and daily interactions?

Exodus 34:2 NIV - "Be ready in the morning, and then come up on Mount Sinai. Present yourself there to me on top of the mountain."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:31 "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles..."
- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."







Devotional: Intentional Preparation for Divine Renewal

The command to be ready and meet God on the mountain highlights the importance of preparation and intentionality in encountering God. Moses' time with God was not incidental—it was scheduled, anticipated, and involved readiness to receive God's guidance and renewal.

God's presence brings renewal, refreshment, and strength. Isaiah describes how waiting on the Lord restores the weary, lifting us above life's challenges. Lamentations reminds us God's mercies are new every morning—providing fresh grace to face each day.

Are you intentionally preparing yourself to meet God daily? How can you cultivate greater spiritual readiness?

Devotional: Living Out Justice, Mercy, and Humility

Walking in God's light is not just about encountering Him in mountain moments but living every day in alignment with His will. Micah reminds us that God desires justice, mercy, and humility. These qualities radiate God's light into our communities.

When we walk in the light, as John describes, we maintain fellowship with God and others, resulting in cleansing and spiritual growth. God's Word guides us, illuminating our path through the challenges and choices life brings.

Reflect on how your daily decisions and actions reflect God's light.

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:10 "...put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator."







Devotional: Continual Transformation Into God's Image

The ultimate lesson from Moses' shining face is that encountering God leads to ongoing transformation into His image. Like Moses' veil that he removed to reveal God's glory shining through, believers are called to remove spiritual veils—barriers, fears, and sin—that hide God's light from the world.

Paul encourages us to be continually renewed in our minds and to put on the new self, reflecting who we were created to be. This is a lifelong process empowered by the Holy Spirit and fueled by daily communion with God.

As you complete this study, embrace the call to live transformed and be a radiant reflection of God's glory wherever you go.
