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Introduction

Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: " Facing the Pain of Grief

Devotional: God Nears the Brokenhearted in Grief

Grief can feel isolating and overwhelming. When the loss shakes your foundation, it's natural to feel broken and vulnerable. But God's Word assures us He is near in these moments. The psalmist reminds us that the *LORD is close to the brokenhearted*. He does not distance Himself from our pain but draws near to those who feel crushed in spirit.

Rather than running from your grief or feeling ashamed of your brokenness, welcome God's presence there. He promises comfort and steadfast love even amid sorrow. Recognize that mourning is part of the healing process and an expression of the love you had and still carry in your heart.

Trust that God is not distant when you hurt—He walks alongside you, ready to save and uplift your spirit. Open your heart gently to His nearness today.

Prayer for Today

Dear Heavenly Father, thank You for being close to my broken heart and saving those crushed in spirit. When grief shakes my foundation, help me to sense Your nearness and trust Your comforting presence. Carry me when I feel weak and remind me I'm not alone in my pain. Your Verse

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 4:6–7 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Devotional: Jesus Offers a Peace Beyond Understanding

Grief often stirs a storm of emotions—fear, anxiety, confusion—and our hearts can feel restless and troubled. Jesus' words are a balm to weary souls: He gives a peace that the world cannot replicate. This peace transcends circumstances and calms the inner turmoil.

Peace isn't the absence of pain but the presence of God's enduring reassurance. When grief's aftershocks shake your faith, you can find peace by fixing your mind on Christ and presenting your worries to Him in prayer. Thanksgiving—even amidst sorrow—softens the heart and opens the door for God's peace to guard it.

Today, invite Jesus to replace your unrest with His peace. Trust that He is in control even when you can't see the path ahead.

	How can you practice presenting your anxieties to God with thanksgiving?
3.	In what ways does God's peace differ from peace the world offers?







Journaling Prompts

1.	Write a letter to Jesus describing your worries and fears.
2.	List moments when you have experienced God's peace despite difficulty.
	Describe what 'perfect peace' means to you and how you can embrace it today.







Prayer for Today

Lord Jesus, thank You for the peace You give—a peace unlike anything the world can offer. When my heart is troubled and fear creeps in, help me to present all my anxieties to You with a thankful heart. Guard my heart and mind with Your perfect peace, even when grief disturbs my soul. Help me to trust You deeply, knowing You hold every pain and need. *In Your gracious name I pray, Amen.*















Your Verse

Jeremiah 29:11 - "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him."
- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding."







Devotional: God's Good Plans Bring Hope Despite Uncertainty

Grief leaves many questions unanswered and the future uncertain. It's natural to wonder if God's plans have been disrupted or if He even cares. But God's promise through Jeremiah reminds us that His plans are meant to prosper us and give hope, even when the journey feels dark.

Trust is the key to moving forward amid uncertainty. It requires surrendering our limited understanding and holding onto the truth that God is working all things for good. Sometimes the 'good' we receive is growth in faith, endurance, and deeper reliance on Him—even through pain.

Today, let go of trying to control or fully understand every detail. Invite God to guide your steps and strengthen your trust that He holds your future safely in His hands.

1.	How does uncertainty about the future affect your faith in God's plans?
	What does it mean to trust God 'with all your heart' rather than your understanding?
	How have you seen God work good through painful circumstances before?

2.	List ways you can intentionally trust God more each day.
3.	Describe what hope looks like to you amidst your grief.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, thank You that Your plans for me are loving, hopeful, and good, even when I do not understand my present pain. Help me to trust You completely and not lean on my own understanding. Your Verse

Romans 8:38–39 – "Nothing in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- 1 John 4:16 "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God."







Devotional: God's Love Remains Unshaken in Grief

When grief feels like it will never end, it's easy to feel isolated and unloved. But God's love is the fortress that cannot be shaken or separated from us, no matter how deep our sorrow.

Nothing in all creation—death, fear, pain, or doubt—can sever the bond of God's love surrounding you. He heals broken hearts and gently binds your wounds. Living in His love means you are held securely and deeply cherished, even at your weakest.

Today, rest in this powerful truth that God's love for you remains constant and unbreakable. Draw strength from His embrace and know you are never alone in your grief.

3.	What does it mean to you to 'live in love' as described in 1 John?







Journaling Prompts

	Write about moments when you've felt God's love during your hardest times.
2.	Describe how God's healing has worked in your brokenness.
3.	List ways you can embrace and share God's love despite your grief.







Prayer for Today

Dear God, thank You that nothing in this world or beyond can separate me from Your unfailing love. When grief threatens to isolate or overwhelm me, remind me that You are my healer and protector. Bind my broken heart and fill me with the assurance that I am deeply loved. Help me live each day in Your love, secure and unshaken. *In Jesus' precious name, Amen.*

















Your Verse

Lamentations 3:22-23 - "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 30:5 "Weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning."
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."







Devotional: God's Faithfulness Brings Fresh Strength Daily

Grieving days are often heavy and exhausting, but God's faithfulness brings new mercies at dawn. Each morning, your soul has an opportunity to receive fresh compassion and strength from the Lord.

This truth invites hope in the midst of tearful nights. Sorrow may last, but it will not have the final word. God's grace is sufficient especially when we feel weak and unable to carry on. His power becomes perfect in those moments.

Today, rest in God's daily renewal and grace. Take one step at a time, trusting His compassionate faithfulness to regenerate your strength for the journey through grief.

1.	How have you experienced new mercies or grace on difficult days?
2.	What does it mean that God's power is made perfect in weakness?
3.	How can you rely more fully on God's faithfulness during grief?







Journaling Prompts

	Record a recent morning when you felt God's mercies renewing your soul.
2.	Write about a time when God's grace was enough in your weakness.
3.	List ways you can invite God's faithfulness into your daily life.







Prayer for Today

Faithful Father, thank You that Your compassions never fail and Your mercies are new every morning. When grief feels overwhelming, remind me to rest in Your grace and lean on Your perfect power. Help me embrace each new day with hope renewed by Your faithfulness. Carry me through weakness and turn my sorrow into strength. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Devotional: Eternal Hope Sustains Us Through Grief

Grief feels heavy and relentless, but God promises a future where mourning ends forever. The vision in Revelation reveals a day when God will personally wipe away every tear, and pain and death will be no more.
