#### Introduction

#### Trusting God Through Depression: Lessons from Veteran Faith

Depression can feel like an overwhelming battle, an unseen war fought in the depths of the soul. Like seasoned veterans who carry the scars and memories of their battles, many believers face inner struggles that challenge their faith and hope. The good news is that the Bible is filled with veteran examples—men and women of God—who endured deep valleys, including emotional lows and despair, yet learned to trust God through it all.

These heroes of faith, from David to Elijah to Paul, faced seasons of depression and distress but found refuge and renewal as they leaned into God's promises. Their stories are not just ancient history; they become the lamp and light for us today when we wrestle with our own fears, sadness, or doubt.

Throughout this 7-day study, we will journey through Scriptures that honor the veteran spirit of endurance, steadfast hope, and trust in God during depression's darkest hours. Each day we will dive into a passage, enriched with supporting verses, and a devotional to encourage you to embrace God's peace, grace, and healing power. Reflection questions and journaling prompts will help you personalize these lessons and invite God's presence deeply into your mental and emotional battles.







**Remember**, trusting God does not mean denying the reality of depression but holding on to Him firmly when the weight feels too heavy. Like veterans who rely on their training and comrades, believers can draw strength from God's Word and His Spirit, who comforts and renews.

May this study inspire you to lean on God's faithfulness, endure with courage, and find hope beyond the shadows.

















#### Your Verse

Psalm 42:11 NIV "Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 34:17 "The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; he delivers them from all their troubles."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed... I will strengthen you and help you."







#### Devotional: Facing Depression: Choosing Hope Over Despair

Depression often feels like an internal war—a battle between hope and despair. The psalmist's honest cry in Psalm 42 reveals this struggle vividly: his soul is downcast and disturbed, yet he resolutely encourages himself to put hope in God. This powerful inner dialogue shows us it's okay to acknowledge our feelings without losing sight of God's presence.

As veterans trust their training and allies in combat, we too are called to trust God who strengthens and delivers us. Depression may cast a heavy shadow, but the Lord's faithfulness is a light that never fades. When feelings overwhelm, remind your soul of God's unchanging love and presence. Pray for the strength to praise Him even amid pain, knowing He listens and cares deeply for your struggles.

Taking the first step to speak truth to your soul and claim God's hope is a victory in itself. Let this day mark the beginning of trusting God to be your refuge inside the storm.

Day 2: XX Strength in Weakness

#### Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 NIV "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses..."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."







Day 2: 🔀 Strength in Weakness

#### Devotional: God's Power Perfected in Our Weakness

Depression can make us feel weak and powerless, but God emphasizes a different perspective. Through Paul's thorn in the flesh, God reveals that His grace is enough and that His power shines brightest when we are weakest. This is a revolutionary truth for those walking through deep struggles: your weakness is not a barrier to God's strength—it is a stage upon which His power is displayed.

Feeling vulnerable or exhausted? That is the perfect moment to lean into God's grace. Grace is unearned favor that sustains us and enables resilience beyond natural strength. Just like veterans know the importance of relying on their gear and team, we are invited to depend on God's sufficiency in our weakest moments.

Allow yourself to let go of the pressure to 'be strong' on your own and rejoice in the strength God gives you to endure. This truth can transform the experience of depression from despair to quiet hope anchored in God's power.

Help me to rely on You fully, knowing You are my strength and refuge. Carry me through my depression with Your mighty hand and remind me daily that I am never alone. Thank You for Your sufficient grace and unfailing love. In Jesus' mighty name, Amen.

















Day 3: Peace Beyond Understanding

#### Your Verse

Philippians 4:6-7 NIV "Do not be anxious about anything... And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you... Do not let your hearts be troubled."
- Colossians 3:15 "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts... and be thankful."







Day 3: 💙 Peace Beyond Understanding

#### Devotional: Receiving God's Peace in Troubled Times

Depression breeds anxiety, fear, and restless thoughts. Yet Scripture offers us a supernatural peace that surpasses human logic. Philippians instructs us to bring every worry and need to God in prayer, alongside thanksgiving. As we intentionally surrender our fears, God's peace acts as a fortress guarding our minds and hearts from the chaos within.

Veterans learn to focus on what they can control and trust leadership amid uncertainty. Similarly, in depression, we learn to release control and anchor in God's promises. This peace does not always remove the pain but shields us from despair's full grip.

Take time today to unburden your heart through prayer and thankfulness. Invite the Holy Spirit to be your peace-giver. You are not alone; Christ, the Prince of Peace, is walking with you through the valley.

Psalm 91:1-2 NIV "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, 'He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Nahum 1:7 "The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him."







#### Devotional: God: Your Shelter and Fortress

Depression can make the world feel unsafe and overwhelming, eroding our sense of security. Psalm 91 offers a powerful picture of God as a shelter—a fortress where believers can hide and find rest amidst storms.

Veterans understand the importance of refuge—safe zones where renewal happens before the next phase of battle. Spiritually, God invites us to dwell in His protective presence constantly. This dwelling is a relationship, a choice to trust and abide in the Almighty's care.

When you feel exposed or vulnerable, intentionally turn inward to God's shelter. Remember He is more than a protector — He is a loving God who provides peace, strength, and shelter you cannot find elsewhere. Trust Him as your fortress today and find restorative rest for your soul.

3.	What fears or worries could you surrender to God's protection?

#### Prayer for Today

**Father God,** You are my refuge and fortress in every trouble. Help me to dwell daily in Your protective presence and find rest in Your shadow. When depression threatens to overwhelm, draw me close so I may experience Your strength and peace. I trust You as my safe place, my loving shelter. Renew my spirit and guard my heart with Your unfailing love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

















Day 5: Holding On When It's Hard

#### Your Verse

Hebrews 10:23 NIV "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Romans 5:3-4 "Suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."
- James 1:12 "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life."







Day 5: Holding On When It's Hard

#### Devotional: Persevering in Hope and Faithfulness

Depression tests our ability to hold on to hope when everything inside feels like giving up. The author of Hebrews reminds us that God is faithful to His promises—even when the path is dark and uncertain. True faith means holding on, not just when life is easy but especially when it isn't.

Like veterans who persevere through long campaigns, believers are invited to endure with an unswerving grip on hope. Suffering refines our character and deepens trust in God's purposes.

Amid depression, choose faith over defeat, perseverance over surrender. Remember that your struggles are recognized by God and that He rewards those who remain steadfast. Your faithful endurance will not be in vain.

# Devotional: Embracing God's Daily Compassion and Faithfulness

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- 1 John 4:4 "He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world."
- Revelation 21:4 "He will wipe every tear from their eyes."







#### Devotional: More Than Conquerors: Victory in Christ

As we conclude this study, it's important to recognize the victory available to believers even in the midst of relapse or ongoing depression. Romans 8 declares that through Christ's love we are guaranteed more than just surviving; we are conquerors. This victory is not about the absence of struggles but about the assurance of God's overwhelming love that sustains and ultimately triumphs.

Veterans return home changed, often still facing battles internally, but with a new identity and hope. Similarly, our identity in Christ gives us strength beyond circumstances. No darkness or depression can separate us from God's love or the hope of restoration.

Celebrate today the reality that through faith in Jesus you have victory and a promise of lasting peace, where every tear will be wiped away. Keep moving forward, sustained by the One who is greater than any challenge.
