Trusting God with Your Adult Children's Decisions



A 7-day journey for mothers and fathers to release control and embrace faith in God's plan for their adult children.





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Introduction

Parenting adult children transforms the heart and faith of every mother and father. After years of guiding, teaching, and praying for their little ones, the transition into adult independence stirs both hope and anxiety. *How do we lovingly let go?* How can we **trust God** with the decisions our adult children make, especially when we worry about their future or safety? This Bible study embraces the challenge of surrendering control to God while remaining a source of wisdom, prayer, and steadfast love.

Letting go doesn't mean giving up on our children; it means giving them to God, who knows their path and holds their heart. This journey is for every parent wrestling with fear over choices made by adult sons and daughters—decisions about relationships, career, faith, or lifestyle. Throughout these seven days, we will walk through biblical examples of women who demonstrated faith and trust amid uncertainty and parental concern.

From Hannah's prayer in the temple to Mary's obedience at the crossroads of destiny, these stories inspire us. We will reflect deeply, pray courageously, and journal honestly about how to replace our fears with faith — to **let go with love** and depend fully on God's sovereign care. May these reflections bolster your trust and refresh your spirit, reminding you that the ultimate guide and protector of your children is the One who loves them unconditionally.















Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Supporting Scriptures

- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD.
- Psalm 37:5 "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will do this."







Devotional: Surrender Control and Choose Faith

When our grown children start making choices we cannot control, our natural response is often worry. What if these decisions lead to hardship? What if they make mistakes? Yet, *God invites us to trust Him fully*, even when the path is unclear. Proverbs 3:5–6 reminds us to trust the Lord wholeheartedly and to avoid leaning on our understanding. This is not easy, especially as parents who love deeply, but trusting God means surrendering the illusion of control and believing that He orders every step.

Jeremiah 29:11 assures us that God has plans for our loved ones—plans to prosper and not to harm. When we commit their futures to Him, Psalm 37:5 promises that He will act on our behalf. This day challenges us to choose faith over fear, to pray for our children with confidence, and to rest in God's sovereignty. Letting go is not abandonment; it is placing our children in the safest hands imaginable.

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Prayer for Today

Your Verse

1 Samuel 1:27-28 - "I prayed for this child, and the LORD has granted me what I asked of him. So now I give him to the LORD. For his whole life he will be given over to the LORD."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 20:4 "May he give you the desire of your heart and make all your plans succeed."
- Philippians 4:6-7 "Do not be anxious about anything... the peace of God... will guard your hearts and your minds."







Devotional: Hold Your Children with Open Hands

Hannah's story is one of heartfelt prayer and courageous surrender. She longed for a child and promised God that if He answered her prayer, she would dedicate her son to Him for life. When Samuel was born, she faithfully kept her vow, knowing God's greater plan exceeded her own hopes.

This deep act of trust and release shows us how to handle the decisions of our children. Even when we treasure them dearly, we must *hold them with open hands*, trusting that God's purposes for them are higher than our own desires. Psalm 20:4 encourages us that God delights in giving us the desires of our hearts and making our plans succeed, but that success is defined by Him.

Philippians 4:6-7 reminds us not to be anxious but to present our concerns to God, and His peace will guard us. Like Hannah, we can pray passionately and then rest peacefully knowing God is faithful to guide and protect our children.







Reflect and Apply

1.	Have you made a promise to God about your children's future? How does that affect your trust?
2.	What emotions come up when you think about 'giving over' your children to God?
3.	How might prayer change your perspective from anxiety to peace?

1.	Write a prayer like Hannah's, dedicating your children to God's care.
2.	Reflect on times God answered your prayers for your children in unexpected ways.
3.	Describe how you can practice releasing your fears through daily prayer.







Prayer for Today

Heavenly Father, like Hannah, I bring my heart's deepest desires to You. I thank You for hearing my prayers and for the precious gift of my children. Today, I choose to release them to Your care, trusting Your wisdom and grace to guide their paths. Fill me with Your peace and help me to be confident in Your loving plan, even when I don't see the full picture. Guard my heart from anxiety and root me in faith. In Jesus' name, Amen. Your Verse

Luke 1:38 – "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "Do not fear, for I am with you...I will strengthen you and help you."
- Romans 8:28 "In all things God works for the good of those who love him."







Devotional: Faithful Obedience in Uncertainty

Mary's story shows us faith amidst uncertainty. She was faced with a future she couldn't fully understand—a calling both extraordinary and daunting. Yet she responded with a profound, simple trust: "May your word to me be fulfilled."

Like Mary, we often face moments when our adult children's choices lead into unknown territory. We may not understand the path or the outcome, but God's promise in Isaiah 41:10 reassures us not to fear because He strengthens and helps us. When we choose obedience, even in uncertainty, we align ourselves with God's good purpose.

Romans 8:28 reminds us that God works all things together for good for those who love Him. Trusting God doesn't always mean the journey feels easy, but it ensures that all the pieces will ultimately be woven into a beautiful plan.

What unknowns about your children's lives cause you the most fear or doubt?
How can Mary's example encourage you to respond with obedience and faith?
In what ways have you seen God work unexpected good in your children's paths?

	Write down what 'obedience' looks like in trusting God with your children now.
2.	Reflect on a time you stepped out in faith despite uncertainty.
3.	List scriptures that bring you comfort when facing unknowns.







Prayer for Today

Lord God, help me to respond like Mary—with surrender and faith—when I face unknowns about my children's lives. Strengthen me not to fear but to trust that You are always with us. Help me to remember that through all circumstances, You work for good. I place my children's futures in Your hands and ask for Your peace to fill my heart. Amen. *















Your Verse

Judges 4:4-5 - "Deborah, a prophet, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time... she held court under the Palm of Deborah."

Supporting Scriptures

- Joshua 1:9 "Be strong and courageous... the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."
- Psalm 46:5 "God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day."







Devotional: Lead with Courage and Divine Strength

Deborah exemplifies a woman of faith who leads with courage. As a judge and prophet in Israel, she directed people in times of uncertainty and conflict. Her example encourages parents to embrace their role with bravery—even when they don't control every outcome.

Like Deborah, we are called to be strong and courageous as stated in Joshua 1:9. Parenting adult children requires bold faith, clear vision, and God's guidance. Deborah's leadership under the Palm reminds us that God is present and working through us—even under pressure.

Psalm 46:5 assures us that God's presence within us means we will not fall; He will help and sustain us. This strength allows us to support and guide our adult children with wisdom and compassion, leaving the results in God's hands.

Prayer for Today

Father, thank You that You are my strength and courage. When I feel weak or overwhelmed about my children's choices, remind me that You are within me and will not let me fall. Help me to lead with wisdom, grace, and faith, trusting You to work all things for good. Use me as a source of support and love, even when I cannot control the outcome. Amen.

Devotional: Be a Steadfast Source of Hope

Ruth's loyalty and faith show us the power of commitment amidst change.

Though she was not the mother of her adult children, her example of steadfastness speaks profoundly to the heart of every parent watching their children face new seasons.

Her famous declaration to Naomi symbolizes a faithful heart that chooses to stay connected, pray, and trust God even when the future is uncertain. Psalm 125:1 likens those who trust God to a mountain that cannot be shaken. This picture inspires us to become that unwavering source of faith for our children.

Hebrews 10:23 encourages us to hold firmly to hope. While our adult children's lives may look different than imagined, our commitment to hope, prayer, and presence remains vital.

Your Verse

- Psalm 56:3 "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you."







Day 6: Esther's Bold Faith for Her People

Devotional: Step into Courage with God's Power

Esther's story echoes the power of bold faith in confronting the unknown.

Though not a mother herself, her courage to advocate for her people under threat inspires us as parents needing great faith for our children's future.

We may feel powerless at times, but Esther's question reminds us that God places us where we are for divine purposes. 2 Timothy 1:7 assures us that God's Spirit doesn't make us timid but empowers us with love and self-discipline to face fears.

When anxiety creeps in, Psalm 56:3 encourages us to place our trust in God. As we pray boldly, we can confidently release our children into God's care, knowing He equips us for the journey.

Your Verse

Ecclesiastes 3:1 - "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:31 "Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength."
- Matthew 6:34 "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself."







Devotional: Rest in God's Perfect Timing

After a week of trusting, releasing, and praying, we arrive at embracing God's timing. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us there is a perfect time for all things in heaven's plan. When adult children make decisions, it unfolds within God's divine schedule—even when it seems slow or confusing to us.

Isaiah 40:31 promises renewed strength for those who hope in the Lord. Waiting with hope is not passive but active faith—an opportunity to rest in God's peace. Matthew 6:34 encourages us to avoid worry about tomorrow, trusting God with the future each day.

This final day calls us to cultivate a heart that patiently rests in God's timing, releasing anxiety and embracing peace. Our children's growth and choices are part of a divine story authored by a loving God who is never late.

1.	Write about what peace means to you in trusting God's timing.

3.	List ways to release worries about the future and live in today's faith.







Prayer for Today

Gracious Father, help me to embrace Your perfect timing for my children's lives. Teach me to hope in You and to find strength as I wait.
