Trusting God with Your Plans



Explore how trusting God leads to true success and peace as you commit your plans to Him with wisdom and faith.





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Introduction

Welcome to this 3-day Bible study on "Trusting God with Your Plans." Life often presents us with numerous decisions and plans—from career ambitions to personal goals and relationships. While it is natural to want to control our own paths, the Bible invites us to entrust our plans to God, who is sovereign, loving, and wise beyond our understanding. "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans" (Proverbs 16:3).

Trusting God means surrendering our desires and timing, believing that His plans for us are good and perfect, even when the path is unclear. It challenges us to let go of anxiety and fear that come with uncertainty and control. Instead, we learn to walk humbly with God, seeking His guidance daily through prayer, Scripture, and quiet reflection.

Your Verse

Proverbs 16:3 NIV - "Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans."

Supporting Scriptures

- Jeremiah 29:11 NIV "For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."
- Psalm 37:5 NIV "Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this."







Devotional: Surrendering Plans to God's Sovereignty

What does it mean to trust God's sovereignty over our plans? Proverbs 16:3 encourages us to "commit to the Lord whatever you do." This isn't a passive statement; it is a call to actively surrender our ambitions, decisions, and daily endeavors to God. *Trusting sovereignty means believing God is in control, even when we can't see the full picture.*

Jeremiah 29:11 reminds us that God's plans are for our good — to give us hope and a future. When we commit our ways, we acknowledge that God's wisdom surpasses our own. This enables us to release the pressure of trying to control every outcome and instead rest in His promise to guide and establish our steps.

Psalms 37:5 further calls us to trust Him as we commit our way. This trust is not blind but rooted in God's proven faithfulness throughout history and in our own lives. As we walk with Him, we grow more confident that He will work all things for our good and His glory.

Today, reflect on how sovereignty affects your view of your plans. Are you holding tightly to control, or are you ready to commit your efforts to God, trusting He will establish your path?

2.	List current plans you feel called to commit to God's guidance this week.
	Journal your emotions when you think about releasing control over your future to God.

Day 2: A Seeking God's Guidance

Your Verse

Psalm 32:8 NIV - "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you."

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:5 NIV "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."
- Proverbs 3:5-6 NIV "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."







Day 2: A Seeking God's Guidance

Devotional: Actively Seeking God's Wisdom and Guidance

Seeking God's guidance is essential when we commit our plans to Him. The Psalmist promises in Psalm 32:8 that God will instruct and counsel us personally with His loving eye upon us. This assurance reminds us that God is not distant but intimately involved in our planning process.

When doubts and confusion arise, James 1:5 encourages us to ask God for wisdom. God's wisdom is abundant and given freely to those who seek it sincerely. This is a beautiful invitation to turn to prayer, not just for peace but for clear direction.

Proverbs 3:5-6 reinforces that trusting God fully requires us to lean not on our own understanding but to submit all our ways to Him. The promise is that He will make our paths straight—removing obstacles, clarifying vision, and aligning us with His perfect plan.

As you reflect today, consider how actively you are seeking God's guidance in your decisions. Are you asking for wisdom? Are you willing to submit even when His answer doesn't match your expectations? Trusting God's guidance transforms uncertainty into peace and empowers us to move confidently forward.

Prayer for Today

Your Verse

Isaiah 40:31 NIV - "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 8:28 NIV "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."
- Hebrews 10:36 NIV "You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what he has promised."







Devotional: Patience and Perseverance in God's Timing

Trusting God with our plans requires patience and perseverance. Isaiah 40:31 offers the wonderful encouragement that those who hope in the Lord will experience renewed strength and endurance. Waiting on God doesn't mean inactivity; it is an active hope that empowers us to keep running the race without growing weary.

Romans 8:28 assures us that God works for the good of those who love Him, even when events seem challenging or confusing. This promise helps us trust that delays or detours are part of God's good, overarching plan.

Hebrews 10:36 reminds us that perseverance is necessary to receive God's promises. Our faith journey includes seasons of patience as God prepares us and the circumstances around us.

Today, consider areas of your life where you might be feeling impatience or doubt about God's timing. Ask God to renew your strength and faith. Trust that in waiting, you are aligning more deeply with His perfect purpose. Growth in trust is a process, and God is faithful to carry us through every step.

1.	Where do you struggle most with trusting God's timing in your plans?
2.	How can Isaiah 40:31 encourage you in moments of weariness or doubt?
	What practices help you nurture patience and hope while waiting on God?







Journaling Prompts

	Reflect on a past situation where waiting on God brought about a better outcome.
2.	Write about your feelings when your plans don't unfold as expected.
3.	Identify practical ways to cultivate perseverance and hope this week.







Prayer for Today

Lord, teach me to wait patiently and trust Your perfect timing. Renew my strength when I grow weary and fill my heart with hope that soars above challenges. Help me persevere in faith, believing You are working all things for my good.
