Your Verse

Psalm 31:1 - "In you, LORD, I have taken refuge; let me never be put to shame; deliver me in your righteousness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Devotional: Embracing God as Our Refuge

Day 1 invites us to embrace God as our refuge. When David wrote Psalm 31, he was overwhelmed, longing for safety and relief from his troubles. He chose to trust God's protection rather than his own strength. This decision is foundational for anyone facing an uncertain future. When we face worry or fear about what lies ahead, where do we turn? Like David, we are called to take refuge in God's unfailing love and righteousness.

Trust means leaning fully on God, acknowledging that He knows all things and works everything for good. It is surrendering control and finding peace in His sovereign care. You might feel vulnerable right now, but God's refuge is a strong fortress where shame, fear, and despair can have no hold. Today, meditate on the promise that God invites you to hide beneath His wings and be kept safe.

Are you willing to trust God as your refuge today, even when the future feels unclear? This is the first step toward embracing His plan — a plan designed in righteousness and love.

Day 2: \(\bar{O}\) Trusting God's Timing

Devotional: Learning to Trust God's Perfect Timing

Day 2 focuses on trusting God's timing in our lives. David's declaration in Psalm 31:14 reminds us of the beauty in saying, "You are my God," fully acknowledging His authority over all seasons. Sometimes we rush ahead or become frustrated when our prayers aren't answered on our timetable. Yet, God's timing is perfect — never late or early — but exactly right for our growth and His greater purpose.

Learning to trust in this timing requires patience and faith. What feels like a delay may actually be unseen preparation or protection. Scripture reminds us there is a divine time orchestrating every event in our lives. When we align our hearts with God's, we admit that we do not have all the answers but that He is working all things together for good.

Today, reflect on how you can surrender your timeline to God, trusting Him to write your story with wisdom and love.
