Your Verse

Acts 2:38 - Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Romans 6:4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead, we too may live a new life.
- Matthew 3:16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him.







Devotional: Discovering What Baptism Truly Means

Baptism is a meaningful act that marks the beginning of your new life in Christ. When Peter tells the crowd in *Acts 2:38* to repent and be baptized, he highlights the connection between turning away from sin and identifying with Jesus through baptism.

Baptism symbolizes dying to your old self and being raised to a new life, just as Jesus demonstrated in *Matthew 3:16* and *Romans 6:4*. It's more than just being in the water — it's about the spiritual transformation happening inside you.

As a teen considering baptism, remember it is your personal declaration of faith — a public way to show you believe in Jesus and His power to forgive and change your life. It's a joyful step to celebrate, marking your commitment to follow Him wholeheartedly.

Your Verse

Colossians 2:12 – Having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through your faith in the working of God, who raised him from the dead.

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 3:27 For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.
- 1 Peter 3:21 Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.







Devotional: The Power and Purpose of Baptism

Baptism matters because it is a powerful symbol of what Jesus has done for us and what God does inside us. The Apostle Paul explains in *Colossians 2:12* that baptism represents being buried with Christ and raised to new life through faith. Baptism is not just a ceremony; it is a testimony of God's resurrection power at work in your life.

Galatians 3:27 reminds us that baptism also clothes us with Christ — it's like putting on new identity, being fully accepted as His child. And in 1 Peter 3:21, baptism symbolizes a pure conscience before God, showing your faith in Christ's resurrection and salvation.

For teens, baptism is an important milestone that honors God and declares your trust in Jesus' forgiveness and grace. It's a public and spiritual expression of your commitment to live a new life empowered by Him.

- Acts 8:36-38 As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. What can stand in the way of my being baptized?"







Day 3: WY Your Step of Faith

Devotional: Taking Your Personal Step of Faith

Baptism is your personal step of faith and obedience to Jesus. In *Mark 16:16*, Jesus clearly connects believing and being baptized with salvation. It's a beautiful step that matches your faith with action.

John 3:5 tells us baptism involves being born of water and the Spirit — it marks a spiritual rebirth. This new beginning is not only about your commitment but also about the work of the Holy Spirit in your life.

The story in *Acts 8:36–38* shows us how the Ethiopian eunuch eagerly chose to be baptized when he learned the good news of Jesus. Like him, you can respond with excitement and faith when you're ready.

Today is a day to consider where you are on your faith journey. Baptism is a step you can take to publicly declare your new identity in Jesus and your desire to follow Him all your life.
