Devotional: Recognizing God's Just Discipline

God's justice is foundational to understanding His discipline. In Psalm 94, the psalmist urgently calls God to rise up and act against the proud and wicked. This demonstrates that God's discipline is not harsh or arbitrary punishment, but the righteous response to injustice and rebellion.

Devotional: Discipline as a Sign of God's Love
