Devotional: God's Just Judgment and Our Accountability

In **Matthew 13:49–50**, Jesus draws a vivid picture of the end times using the metaphor of a net that gathers all kinds of fish — symbolizing humanity. Just as the fishermen sort good fish from bad, angels will separate people based on their hearts and deeds. This parable emphasizes God's absolute justice, where no one escapes His righteous judgment.

Why is this important for believers today? It reminds us that while God's grace is immense, **accountability remains**. Our lives matter, and choices align us either with the kingdom of life or lead to rejection. This truth should inspire reverence, humility, and perseverance in living righteously.
