Understanding Greed and Priorities Through Jesus' Parables



Explore Jesus' words on greed and priorities through the Gospels, focusing on the Rich Fool's parable to guide heart and life choices.





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Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible Study Plan on the Gospels, where we will center our attention on Jesus' teaching about greed and materialism. In Luke 12:13–21, Jesus tells the parable of the Rich Fool, a striking story that challenges us to examine our priorities and warns against the perils of misplaced values.

Jesus' ministry, as presented in the Gospels, consistently points us toward a kingdom perspective — one that values the eternal over the temporary, generosity over selfishness, and trust in God over trust in possessions. This parable is a vivid example: a wealthy man accumulates abundant crops, planning to store them all for himself but dies unexpectedly. Jesus declares that such a person is a fool because his life is demanded that very night, and his riches can do nothing for his soul.

This study plan invites you to delve deep into the teachings of Jesus regarding greed, wealth, and true treasure. Over the next seven days, we will explore Scripture passages that illuminate the dangers of greed, the necessity of wise stewardship, and the call to live with eternal priorities. As you engage, consider how these truths resonate in your own life. Would you be willing to let go of materialism and store up treasures in heaven instead? How can a kingdom mindset transform your decisions, relationships, and trust?

Prepare your heart and mind as we journey through the Gospels to uncover Jesus' timeless wisdom about what it means to live abundantly and wisely!















Your Verse

Luke 12:15 – "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 6:19–20 "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth... but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven."
- Ecclesiastes 5:10 "Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income."







Devotional: Guarding Against the Greed Trap

Jesus begins with a clear warning: greed is dangerous and misleading. In Luke 12:15, He tells the crowd to be on guard against all kinds of greed, emphasizing that life is more than possessions. The parable of the Rich Fool that follows illustrates this vividly. The rich man's heart was set on earthly abundance, but his life was demanded that very night. His riches could not save him or extend his days.

Today, God invites us to reflect on where our hearts are focused. Are we fixated on accumulating wealth, or are we seeking what truly satisfies? This parable challenges us with a vital question: What is it that gives our life meaning? It's tempting to think more possessions equal security or happiness, but Jesus counters this with a vision of life that transcends material gain.

Let this be a moment of self-examination. How do you view your resources? Are they means to bless others and honor God, or have they become idols? May God open your eyes to the richness of a life lived with eternal priorities rather than earthly anxieties.

Day 2: 🖓 Biblical Warnings About Wealth

Devotional: Love Money or Love God?

Paul's letter to Timothy serves as a sober reminder of the dangers tied to pursuing wealth. His warning that "the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil" echoes the caution Jesus gave in His parable. It's not money itself that corrupts, but the deep affection and trust placed in it.

Wealth, when idolized, can lead to temptation, harmful desires, and spiritual downfall. These biblical texts form a consistent chorus advising believers to guard their hearts and practice contentment. The peace and righteousness that come from God contrast sharply with the instability of riches.

Ask yourself: where is my trust? What do I run to in times of fear or insecurity? God calls us to be centered in Him, not our bank accounts. Contentment doesn't mean poverty of spirit, but freedom from slavery to possessions.

Through today's reflection, seek God's help to align your attitudes about money and possessions with His truth, resisting temptations and cultivating joyful contentment.

Devotional: Investing in Eternal Riches

Jesus' sermon on the mount repeatedly directs us to eternal realities rather than temporary possessions. In Matthew 6:19–21, He urges us to store treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and thieves cannot break in and steal. This is a call to invest our lives and resources in what lasts forever.

Why does Jesus make this point? Because our hearts follow our treasures. If we invest in earthly things, our hearts become tied to them, yet these things are fleeting and insecure. But when we seek heavenly treasures—through love, service, faith, and generosity—our hearts find true security and reward.

Reflection on priorities and mindset is key here. We're challenged to ask ourselves where our focus lies: beneath the shadow of dust and decay, or in the glorious unseen kingdom? How can we reorder our lives to reflect what is truly valuable to God?

Today, consider what it means to shift your investments from the temporal to the eternal, and seek God's help in that renewal.

Prayer for Today

Devotional: Freedom Through Trusting God

Trust is foundational to overcoming greed and anxiety about material things. Psalm 37:16–17 contrasts the security of the righteous, even with little, to the unstable wealth of the wicked. It calls us to place our confidence not in the abundance of earthly resources but in God's sustaining power.

Jesus elaborates on this in Matthew 6:25, encouraging us not to worry excessively about our daily needs because the heavenly Father knows and cares for us deeply. This trust frees us from the bondage of greed and worry, enabling us to live more peaceably and generously.

Proverbs 3:5-6 reminds us to trust God wholeheartedly, not relying on our limited understanding. When we surrender control and place our needs in God's hands, we can experience freedom from greed's grip and find true provision that satisfies both body and soul.

Today, meditate on God's faithfulness and provision, inviting Him to strengthen your trust over possessions and worries.

3.	What practical steps can increase your trust in God's provision?

Devotional: Living Freely Through Generosity

One of the antidotes to greed is generosity. The early church in Acts set a powerful example, living in community and sharing generously with those in need. Jesus taught that giving opens the door to receiving blessings beyond material measures.

Generosity reflects the heart of God and demonstrates our trust in Him as provider. When we give joyfully, we participate in kingdom expansion and counter cultural selfishness. 2 Corinthians 9:7 reminds us that the attitude behind giving matters deeply; God delights in cheerful givers who give from a heart of love and gratitude.

This practice reshapes our understanding of wealth, shifting focus from accumulation to blessing others. When we align with God's generosity, our lives become channels of His grace, and our hearts are freed from greed's grasp.

Today, consider how you might embrace generosity as a practical expression of kingdom living.

Devotional: Prioritize God's Kingdom Daily

Jesus' instruction to seek God's kingdom first is a call to reorder priorities in our lives. The pursuit of wealth or comfort is often the world's default path, but the kingdom of God requires different values and focus.

Romans 12:2 encourages transformation by renewing our minds, breaking free from worldly patterns and embracing God's perspective. Philippians 3:20 reminds us that our ultimate citizenship isn't here but in heaven, which should influence how we live daily.

Living with kingdom-first priorities affects our decisions, relationships, and use of resources. This ongoing alignment shapes a life marked by purpose and peace, free from anxiety about earthly gain.

Reflect today on what it means to seek God's kingdom first and how you can practically embody that in your daily walk.
