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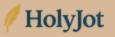

Devotional: God's Encouragement Through Prophecy

John identifies himself as a companion in suffering, reminding us that this revelation is meant for everyday believers facing trials, persecution, or uncertainty. John's eyewitness visions are a divine message to help the Church hold fast.

The purpose of Revelation is not to frighten or confuse but to offer hope and perseverance. As Paul explains in Romans, Scripture overall is written for our instruction and encouragement. Revelation follows this same pattern by unveiling God's ultimate plan and inviting us to trust Him fully.

Remember today that Revelation is for you — to inspire faith, foster endurance, and deepen the assurance that God's kingdom will triumph. Approach it as a personal word from God to your heart.

Devotional: Christ, the Slain Lamb, Sovereign King

The Lamb who appears as slain symbolizes Jesus' sacrificial death and victorious exaltation. Despite looking slain, He stands at the center of the heavenly throne, worthy to open the scroll and enact God's plan.

This image powerfully combines sacrifice with authority. Jesus' death paid the price for humanity's sins, and His resurrection confirmed His victory over death and evil.






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
