Devotional: Why Jesus Calls Us to the Narrow Gate

Today, we confront one of the most challenging claims of Christianity — the call to enter through the narrow gate. Jesus' words in Matthew 7:13–14 starkly contrast two ways of life: one wide and easy leading to destruction, the other narrow and demanding leading to life.

Why does Jesus present the path to salvation as narrow? Because the journey of faith requires surrender, repentance, and obedience. It isn't about cultural popularity or convenience, but about following Him wholeheartedly.

John 14:6 further emphasizes that Jesus Himself is the exclusive way to God, which some might see as restrictive or 'too narrow.' However, this exclusivity is grounded in the truth of God's plan to reconcile humanity to Himself through Jesus' death and resurrection.

Luke 13:24 challenges us to "make every effort" to enter, highlighting that discipleship requires intentionality and perseverance. The narrow gate is not a trap but an invitation to life in its fullest.
