Your Verse

Matthew 25:46 – "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

Supporting Scriptures

- Mark 9:43 "If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go into hell, where the fire never goes out."
- Revelation 20:14 "Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death."







Devotional: Hell is a Real and Serious Place

Today we confront the sobering reality of hell as described in Scripture. Jesus is direct in Matthew 25:46 about the eternal nature of punishment. The word 'eternal' here is the same for both punishment and life, indicating seriousness and lasting consequence.

Mark 9:43 further warns us about the dangers of sin leading to hell, described as a place "where the fire never goes out." Revelation 20:14 depicts hell as the "lake of fire," symbolizing final judgment and separation from God.

These passages emphasize that hell is not just a metaphor or a myth, but a real destiny for those who reject God's salvation. However, this truth calls us not to despair but to respond in faith and repentance. Hell reveals God's justice and the gravity of sin, but also points us toward the hope found in Jesus Christ.

Understanding hell's reality helps us appreciate God's mercy and motivates us to share the gospel with urgency and compassion.

Your Verse

Romans 2:5-6 - "But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 89:14 "Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; love and faithfulness go before you."
- 2 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise... not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."







Day 2: \$\infty\$ God's Justice and Mercy

Devotional: The Balance of God's Justice and Mercy

The Bible consistently reveals God as both just and merciful. Romans 2:5-6 warns of the consequences of a hardened heart, emphasizing that God's judgment is righteous and inevitable. God's justice ensures that sin and evil do not go unnoticed or unpunished.

Psalm 89:14 beautifully describes God's throne as founded on righteousness and justice, underscored by love and faithfulness. This balance teaches us that God's judgments are fair, carried out within the framework of His loving character.

At the same time, 2 Peter 3:9 reminds us how earnest God is for everyone to repent and avoid perishing. His patience demonstrates mercy, offering us multiple opportunities for repentance and restoration.

Recognizing God's justice and mercy together helps us approach the topic of hell with respect and hope, understanding that God desires restoration rather than destruction.

Romans 6:23 - "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 6:7-8 "...a man reaps what he sows."
- John 3:36 "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life..."







Devotional: Understanding Sin, Death, and Choice

Sin has real consequences that lead to spiritual death. Romans 6:23 clearly states that the 'wages' or earned outcome of sin is death—a separation from God.

Galatians 6:7-8 underscores the principle of sowing and reaping: our choices have predictable results. Meanwhile, John 3:36 provides the hope-filled alternative—believing in Jesus results in eternal life, but rejecting Him leads to eternal separation.

Hell, then, is ultimately linked to the choice each person makes regarding Christ. God respects human freedom, inviting everyone into a relationship with Him but not forcing that choice. This makes the Gospel message urgent and precious. No one is sent to hell without their own response to God's offer of salvation.

Recognizing sin's consequences motivates us to embrace God's gift with grateful hearts and live in obedience.

- Matthew 13:49–50 "This is how it will be at the end of the age... They will throw them into the blazing furnace."
- Jude 1:7 "Suffering the punishment of eternal fire."







Devotional: Why Does Hell Exist?

Hell serves a purposeful role within God's overall plan of justice and righteousness. 2 Thessalonians 1:7–9 describes hell as everlasting destruction and separation from God's presence, highlighting its solemn purpose beyond mere punishment—it is the final consequence of rejecting God.

Matthew 13:49–50 uses imagery of a blazing furnace to illustrate hell's role as a place of ultimate separation and judgment at the end of the age. Jude 1:7 confirms eternal fire as a symbol of divine judgment against persistent sin.

Hell exists because God honors human freedom, enforces justice, and respects His own holiness. It reveals the seriousness with which God views evil and provides a just response to rebellion against His goodness.

Yet, the existence of hell also magnifies the love God extends in offering salvation to all who repent. It reminds us that God desires none to perish but all to come to repentance.

- Romans 5:8 "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Devotional: Embracing Hope in Christ

Though the reality of judgment and hell is sobering, the Bible overwhelmingly offers hope through Jesus Christ. In John 14:1–3, Jesus comforts His followers with a promise to prepare a place and return to bring them home. This assurance provides peace amid uncertainty.

1 John 2:2 reminds us that Jesus' sacrifice was sufficient to cover all sin—past, present, and future. Romans 5:8 demonstrates God's love in Christ, dying for us even when we were undeserving.

Hope in Christ counters fear by offering forgiveness, restoration, and eternal life. It underscores that hell need not be our destiny when we trust Jesus as Lord and Savior.

As you meditate on these truths, allow hope to replace fear, knowing God's grace is greater than all our shortcomings.

- Matthew 6:19–21 "Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."







Day 6: 6 Living with Eternal Perspective

Devotional: Focus on What Lasts Forever

Understanding hell's eternal nature calls us to live with an eternal perspective. Colossians 3:1-2 urges us to set our hearts on heavenly things rather than the temporary concerns of this world.

- John 1:12 "Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God."

Devotional: Accepting God's Grace Today

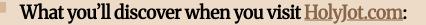
