Introduction

Reflect on how the promise of Satan's binding encourages you today. What areas of your life need Christ's reign and peace? As we begin this study, keep your heart open to God's renewing work and the hope embedded in His kingdom.

Understanding Satan's Binding is central to grasping the Millennial Reign. Revelation 20:4–5 describes resurrection and reign — the saints who reign with Christ during this time. Satan's influence is restrained, allowing God's people to live in peace.

Jesus declared in John 12:31 that His victory would defeat the devil's power. Colossians 2:15 reflects on the spiritual triumph achieved on the cross, which initiates this binding.

Consider how Satan's influence has impacted your life. How does knowing he will be bound for a time change your perspective? This binding not only refers to physical constraints but indicates a profound spiritual victory that enables God's kingdom to advance without hindrance.

The First Resurrection is a glorious promise to believers. Revelation 20:6 describes those who will rise to reign with Christ and be spared the 'second death'—eternal separation from God.

1 Thessalonians 4:16 assures us that the resurrected believers will rise first when Christ returns, while John 5 reminds us of the power of Jesus' voice to raise all from the dead.

Reflect on the hope embedded in resurrection. How does this promise encourage you when facing loss or uncertainty? This resurrection marks the beginning of the reign of Christ with His saints. It is a reassurance that death is not the end but a gateway to eternal life and fellowship with our Savior.

The Reign of Christ ushers in peace and justice for a thousand years, but Revelation 20:7–8 explains that this period will end with one final test when Satan is released. Before that, God's saints enjoy the fulfillment of Daniel's prophecy about God's kingdom being given to the saints and Psalm 72's vision of expansive, righteous rule.

Consider how the reign of Christ on Earth fulfills God's promises and sets the stage for eternal restoration.

Reflect: What does it mean for Christ to reign with His saints? How do God's kingdom and justice manifest in this era? Though this reign is temporary, it provides a foretaste of eternity.

Reflect on the assurance that God's holy judgment ultimately prevails over evil. How does knowing God will defend and protect His people impact your trust in Him? This reminds us that although evil appears strong, God's sovereignty is unshakable.
