#### Devotional: The Hope of Christ's Imminent Return

Understanding the Pre-Tribulation Rapture begins with the hope of Christ's promise to come for His church before the Tribulation. In 1 Thessalonians 4:16–17, Paul vividly describes the moment when Jesus will return," and believers—both those resurrected and those alive—will be caught up to meet Him in the air.

This event, often called the Rapture, is foundational to the Pre-Trib view because it depicts a gathering of the church separate from the judgments described during the Tribulation. Jesus Himself promises in John 14:2–3 that He is preparing a place for us and will return to take us to be with Him, reinforcing this personal and loving rescue.

Revelation 3:10 offers additional comfort, suggesting believers will be kept from "the hour of trial," which many interpret as the Tribulation period. This provides the theological basis for the belief that the church will be spared from the severe judgments ahead.

Grasping this hope encourages us to live expectantly, knowing our Savior's return is imminent. The Pre-Tribulation Rapture reminds us of God's mercy and faithfulness.

Meanwhile, 2 Thessalonians 2 explains that certain events, like rebellion and the revealing of the "man of lawlessness," must occur before Christ's return. This distinction helps clarify the sequence of end-time events, supporting a Pre-Trib interpretation.

Understanding this timing is vital as it shapes our hope and preparedness, reminding us to stay vigilant and faithful while trusting God's sovereign plan.

#### Devotional: God's Justice and Mercy in the Tribulation

Jesus foretells in Matthew 24 of great distress unlike any before, painting a picture of intense trials and world upheaval. Revelation 6 portrays this time as the 'great day of their wrath,' emphasizing the severity of God's righteous judgment.

The Pre-Tribulation belief holds the church will be absent during this time, spared from God's wrath to fulfill His plan of judgment on an unbelieving world. This distinction offers comfort and underscores God's justice and mercy.

Reflecting on the Tribulation highlights the seriousness of sin and the urgency of sharing the gospel before these events unfold.

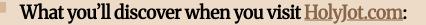




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
