Day 1: What Is the Tribulation?

#### Devotional: The Tribulation Defined and Its Divine Purpose

The book of **Daniel** frames the Tribulation within a prophetic timeline, mentioning a 'seven' period connected with pivotal events. Revelation describes those who emerge from this 'great tribulation' as victorious and faithful.

But what is the Tribulation's purpose? While it reveals God's judgment, it also serves as a divine warning to mankind to turn back to Him. The period signifies both *Wrath* and a call to repentance, emphasizing God's justice and mercy intertwined.

Understanding its nature prepares us spiritually, helping believers discern God's plans and His protection. It reminds us that though trials will come, God's people—through faith—will ultimately prevail and be comforted.

The pre-tribulation rapture theory proposes that believers will be taken up to meet Christ in the air **before** the Tribulation begins, sparing them from the severe judgments ahead. 1 Thessalonians 4:16–17 describes the Lord's return to gather His followers to Himself, emphasizing hope and rescue.

John 14:3 reassures believers that Jesus will personally come for us, underscoring intimacy and care. Moreover, Revelation 3:10 offers a promise that some will be kept from 'the hour of trial'—traditionally understood as the Tribulation period.

This viewpoint encourages readiness and comfort, promising that God will protect His people from the worst times to come. However, believers are exhorted to remain vigilant and faithful, as the timing of Christ's return is unknown.

Paul warns in 2 Thessalonians 2 that the day of the Lord will come unexpectedly, like a thief—indicating believers must be watchful throughout hardships. Revelation 20:4 affirms that those who remain faithful will reign with Christ, highlighting the victorious outcome despite tribulation suffering.

Enduring the Tribulation is a call to resilient faith and deep reliance on God's sustaining power. This perspective offers a powerful testimony of perseverance, witness, and ultimate hope for believers who face trials.
