# Understanding Your Worldview as a Teen

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#### Introduction

What is a worldview? Simply put, a worldview is the lens through which we see and interpret the world around us. It shapes our understanding of purpose, right and wrong, and how we live our daily lives. As teenagers growing up in a fast-changing culture, it's vital to understand not only your own worldview but also how it compares to others.

This three-day study is designed to help you explore the foundations of a Christian worldview and contrast it with some popular cultural views prevalent today. You'll learn why your worldview matters deeply, influencing your decisions, relationships, and sense of meaning.

Our world offers many competing answers to questions like: Why am I here? What is right and wrong? How should I live? Those answers affect everything you do. By seeing these through the lens of Scripture, you can build a clear and confident foundation for your life.

Throughout this study, you'll discover God's truth about your purpose and identity, and how viewing the world from a biblical perspective can empower and guide you. Whether you're facing peer pressure, life choices, or just wondering about what truly matters, this plan will equip you to think deeply and live intentionally.

#### Devotional: What Shapes Your View of the World?

Understanding what a worldview is is foundational to living a meaningful life. Your worldview shapes how you interpret everything: your experiences, values, and even your identity. It acts like a pair of glasses that tint your perception of reality.

Romans 12:2 challenges us not to simply absorb the culture around us, but to be transformed by renewing our minds through God's truth. This renewal helps us develop a Christian worldview — one rooted in God's character and word.

Many cultural worldviews are built on shifting values and opinions, but the Bible offers a firm foundation. Proverbs 3:5 reminds us to trust God rather than depending solely on our own understanding, which can be limited or skewed. Colossians warns us to be careful of philosophies that look wise but can lead us away from truth.

**As a teen,** this means you have the choice to evaluate what you believe and why. You don't have to simply accept every message from media, friends, or society. Instead, you can seek God's perspective and allow it to guide your life.

#### Devotional: Why Jesus is the Ultimate Truth

Today's focus is comparing the Christian worldview with some common cultural perspectives. Many in culture promote the idea that all beliefs are equally true or that truth is personal and flexible. However, the Bible presents Jesus as the ultimate truth.

John 14:6 clearly declares that Jesus is the only way to truly know God and live a meaningful life. This isn't about dismissing others but recognizing that God's truth offers a firm foundation for hope and purpose.

Psalm 119 helps us understand how God's word illuminates our path, offering guidance that culture often lacks or changes constantly. Cultural views may encourage self-centeredness or relativism, but Scripture urges us not to love the things of this world so deeply that we lose sight of eternal truths (*1 John 2:15*).

**As a teen,** you are surrounded by competing messages about identity, morality, and purpose. Choosing a Christian worldview means carefully considering what is true and good and aligning your life with God's revelation rather than fluctuating societal opinions.

#### Devotional: Walking Humbly and Living Faithfully

Understanding a Christian worldview is only the beginning. Living it out daily is where true transformation happens. *Micah 6:8* sums up what God desires: justice, mercy, and humility.

When you live by a Christian worldview, your purpose is clear and grounded in God's goodness. Even when life is hard, *Romans 8:28* reassures that God is working for your good. This perspective gives hope and strength to keep trusting Him.

*Ephesians 4:22–24* encourages you to leave behind old ways and embrace the new self God creates within you — one that seeks righteousness and holiness. As a teen, this means making choices that reflect God's character: showing kindness, standing up for what's right, and relying on God's power to change your heart.

**Living a Christian worldview** is a daily journey of faith and growth. It means letting God shape how you see yourself and your role in the world, fueling your actions with grace and humility.
