Introduction

Welcome to this 3-day Bible study on the Gospels, centered around the powerful message in Mark 3:23–27. In a world often marked by division—whether in communities, families, or even churches—the words of Jesus remind us of a deeper truth: unity in Him has the power to overcome any spiritual attack or conflict.

The Gospels, the life-changing accounts of Jesus' ministry, death, and resurrection, are filled with lessons of love, reconciliation, and the strength found in oneness with God and one another. Mark 3:23–27, often called "The House Divided" passage, vividly shows Jesus refuting accusations about His power by illustrating that a divided kingdom cannot stand. Here, Jesus teaches that He casts out demons by the Spirit of God, emphasizing that His authority unites rather than divides.

Over the next three days, we will delve into the Gospels to uncover how Jesus' message promotes unity in the face of division and opposition. Together, we will deepen our understanding of spiritual warfare and embrace the truth that when we stand united in Christ, no attack—whether from within or without—can prevail against us.

Prepare your heart to be challenged, enlightened, and encouraged to live out the unity Jesus called His followers to. Let us journey through Scripture and experience the transformative power of being one in Christ as we explore His words and works in the Gospels.





Day 1: Recognizing Spiritual Division



Your Verse

Mark 3:23-27 - "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand."

Supporting Scriptures

- *John 17:21 - "that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you."*
- *Ephesians 4:3 - "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."*



Devotional: Understanding the Danger of Division

Jesus clearly warns against division, a concept just as relevant today as it was then. In Mark 3:23–27, He addresses an accusation trying to undermine His mission by suggesting He acts by demonic power. His response reminds us that *a divided kingdom cannot stand*. This principle applies spiritually and relationally: any division weakens and leaves us vulnerable.

In the Gospels, Jesus' call is for unity—unity with God and among His followers. John 17:21 reveals this heart as Jesus prays for believers to be one just as He and the Father are one. Ephesians 4:3 encourages us to actively pursue this unity through peace and the Spirit's bond.

Recognizing spiritual division is the first step toward healing and victory. When we acknowledge how division can fragment our faith communities and relationships, we open the door to God's unifying power. Let us ask God to reveal areas in our hearts and lives where division may exist and surrender those to Him for restoration.



Reflect and Apply

1. Where do I see division impacting my faith community or personal life?

2. How can recognizing division help me depend more on God's unifying Spirit?

3. What might Jesus be asking me to surrender to Him for the sake of unity?



Journaling Prompts

1. List areas in your own life where division has caused conflict or weakness.

2. Reflect on moments when unity brought strength or healing—what made those moments possible?

3. Write a prayer asking God to reveal and heal divisions in your relationships and church.

Your Verse

Mark 3:27 – “But if it is by the Spirit of God that I drive out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.”

Supporting Scriptures

- *Colossians 1:13 – “For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves.”*
- *Luke 11:20 – “But if I drive out demons by the finger of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you.”*



Devotional: Standing Firm Under Christ's Authority

The authority of Jesus is the foundation for true unity and spiritual protection. In Mark 3:27, Jesus asserts that His power to cast out demons is by the Spirit of God, signaling that the kingdom of God is breaking into the world.

This powerful truth teaches us that unity in Christ is not merely human effort but a spiritual reality rooted in God's kingdom. Colossians 1:13 highlights how believers are transferred from darkness into this kingdom, a place of life, victory, and protection from evil forces.

Luke 11:20 reinforces that Jesus' spiritual authority is active and present. When we unite ourselves with Jesus and His kingdom, we receive the protection and strength to resist division, temptation, and attacks from the enemy.

By embracing Jesus' authority and the kingdom He brings, we are called to stand together, empowered by the Spirit to overcome every challenge. This unity shields us and builds resilience within our community of faith.

Day 3: 🤝 Living Out Unity in Christ



Your Verse

John 13:34-35 – “A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.”

Supporting Scriptures

- *Romans 12:5 – “so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.”*
- *1 Corinthians 1:10 – “I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you.”*



Devotional: Love: The Heart of Our Unity

Jesus' final teaching to His disciples before His crucifixion centers on love as the mark of true unity. In John 13:34–35, He gives a new command: love one another just as He has loved us. This love is the bond that defeats division and spiritual attacks because it reflects God's own heart.

Romans 12:5 reminds us that, though many, we are one body in Christ, connected and dependent on each other. Spiritual unity is a lived reality that requires intentional love, humility, and commitment.

Paul's urging in 1 Corinthians 1:10 echoes this call, asking believers to strive for agreement and avoid divisions. Unity is not uniformity but a harmony of hearts focused on Christ's love.

Living out this love and unity daily strengthens our faith and witnessed powerfully to the world around us. Reflect on your relationships and community—how can you embody this new command in practical ways? Through forgiveness, understanding, and compassion, the dividing walls break down, and God's kingdom advances.



Reflect and Apply

1. What does it look like for me to love others as Jesus loves, especially those I struggle with?

2. How can I contribute to unity in my church or community today?

3. Where might God be calling me to surrender pride or bitterness for the sake of peace?



Journaling Prompts

1. Write about a relationship where you can intentionally show Jesus' love more fully.

2. Reflect on how being 'one body' influences your role within your church or group.

3. List practical steps you can take this week to promote unity and peace.

Prayer for Today
