Devotional: Breaking Barriers Through Christ's Love

God's love unites us in ways the world often can't understand. In Galatians 3:28, Paul writes about a radical unity that breaks down all barriers between people—whether race, social status, or gender. For teens growing up in a world filled with divisions and labels, this is life-changing.

Jesus showed this love by spending time with people from all walks of life—outcasts, sinners, friends, and strangers alike. His example challenges us to do the same. God doesn't see our skin color, background, or differences as obstacles but as part of His beautiful creation.

Devotional: Valuing God's Design: Different but One

Devotional: Practical Ways to Reflect God's Unity
