#### Devotional: Jesus, Our Perfect and Redeeming Lamb

**The lamb** is one of the most powerful symbols in the Bible representing innocence, sacrifice, and redemption. In the Old Testament, lambs were used as sacrificial animals to atone for sin, pointing ahead to Jesus, the *ultimate Lamb* who would give His life for humanity.

John the Baptist identifies Jesus as "the Lamb of God" who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). This title reveals Jesus' role as the perfect sacrifice—without blemish or fault—who willingly offered Himself to restore our relationship with God.

Meditating on the lamb helps believers appreciate both the seriousness of sin and the depth of God's love. Jesus as the lamb symbolizes not just suffering, but victory over sin and death. Through Him, we receive forgiveness and new life.

Reflect on what it means to be covered by the blood of the Lamb and how this symbol invites us into a place of humility, gratitude, and trust.

# Devotional: Abiding in Christ: The True Vine and Branches

This metaphor highlights the critical connection believers must have with Christ in order to thrive spiritually.

Branches draw life from the vine, just as we draw spiritual nourishment and strength from Jesus. Apart from Him, we can do nothing meaningful in kingdom work or personal holiness. 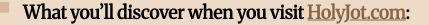




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
