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#### Introduction

#### Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 – "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







#### Devotional: God's Presence in Brokenness

Depression can feel like a thick darkness that isolates and overwhelms. For many veterans, the wounds of battle extend beyond the physical, leaving scars invisible yet deeply painful. The psalmist reminds us that when our hearts are broken and spirits crushed, God's presence is nearer than we might realize. He offers comfort, healing, and salvation.

Imagine God as a tender light gently illuminating your darkest moments, not to erase the pain immediately but to assure you that you are not abandoned. Day 2: A Hope Beyond the Horizon









#### Your Verse

Romans 15:13 – "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Lamentations 3:22–23 "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning."
- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you."







## Devotional: Anchored in God's Renewing Hope

Hope is essential to carry us through the storm of depression and despair. Yet when facing the shadows, hope can feel out of reach. Paul's words remind us that God Himself is the source of all hope - a hope that is alive, vibrant, and full of promises for joy and peace.

As veterans understand the value of perseverance, God invites us to persevere with Him, trusting His plans for our lives. His compassions are renewed daily no matter how dark the night seems. This hope anchors your soul, reminding you that better days lie ahead. Even in your lowest moments, God is working for your good.

Hold onto this hope today, allowing joy and peace to spring up in your heart as you place your trust fully in Him.

#### Devotional: God's Power in Our Weakness

Feelings of weakness and helplessness accompany depression, but God's grace is our sustaining power. Paul's struggle with his own hardships reminds us that God's power shines brightest when we feel the most fragile. In moments of weakness, God's grace is enough.

Veterans know the importance of resting in a strength greater than their own. This spiritual truth offers freedom from striving and guilt — you are not alone, nor are you expected to carry the entire weight. Instead, God offers refuge, strength, and an ever-present help in every battle, internal or external.

Lean into His strength today, surrendering your fragility to the One who makes weakness powerful.

- Isaiah 61:3 "To bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes."







## Devotional: God's Healing and Guidance

Day 5: Compassion in Our Trials

#### Devotional: Boldly Approaching a Compassionate God

#### Devotional: Jesus—the Guide Through Darkness
