Your Verse

Psalm 18:2 - "The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 91:4 "He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart."
- 2 Samuel 22:3 "My God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation. He is my stronghold, my refuge and my savior."

Devotional: Finding Refuge in the Divine Shield

As a veteran, you understand the importance of defense—having a shield that protects you from harm. Spiritually, God is that shield. In today's passage, David praises God not just as a distant deity, but as a rock and fortress, a personal refuge amid life's battles.

This divine protection isn't passive; it is active and relentless. God fights your battles and invites you to stay close under His wings.

Your Verse

2 Corinthians 12:9 - "But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 40:29 "He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak."
- Psalm 73:26 "My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."







Day 2: 🖰 Strength in Weakness

Devotional: Grace That Empowers in Your Weakest Moments

Many veterans have experienced seasons of weakness, whether physical, emotional, or spiritual. It can be tempting to feel inadequate or hopeless in these moments. Yet, Paul's words in 2 Corinthians highlight a divine paradox: God's power shines brightest through our weaknesses.

Instead of hiding your vulnerabilities, bring them before God. Let His grace reassure you that, even in your weakest state, you are strong through Him.

- Ephesians 6:12 "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."
- 2 Timothy 4:7 "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

- Romans 8:24-25 "For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently."







Day 5: A Walking by Faith, Not Sight

Devotional: Trusting God Beyond Circumstances

- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."







Devotional: God's Tender Care for Your Brokenness

Many veterans carry visible and invisible wounds—scars from battle, memories that haunt, and burdens that weigh heavily. God's Word promises healing for the brokenhearted and a tender care for every wound.

- Psalm 33:18 "But the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love."
- Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."







Devotional: Abundant Hope Through God's Spirit

After battles fought and challenges faced, hope is the crowning victory. Paul's prayer invites you to receive joy, peace, and overflowing hope through the Holy Spirit.

Hope is not wishful thinking but a confident expectation anchored in God's love and promises. When you place your trust in Him, your heart becomes a reservoir of hope that can sustain you through any hardship.
