Day 1: 🂔 Facing the Pain of Separation

#### Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."







Day 1: V Facing the Pain of Separation

#### Devotional: God Draws Near to Your Broken Heart

When service friendships suddenly grow distant or end, it hurts deeply. The grief of separation can feel overwhelming, leaving you wondering why relationships that once seemed unbreakable now feel so fractured. Scripture does not ignore this pain. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that *God is near when our hearts are broken*.

As veterans, bonds formed in service are sacred. When those bonds shift, it's normal to feel crushed. But the Lord promises to save those who are crushed in spirit and to heal broken hearts. This healing starts with acknowledging the pain honestly before God, inviting Him into the places where you feel isolated or abandoned.

Remember, grieving a relationship is part of healing. It does not mean failure or weakness—it means you value what was lost. God draws close to you especially in those moments to comfort and restore.

Day 1: 💔 Facing the Pain of Separation

#### Prayer for Today

**Dear Lord,** today my heart feels heavy from separation and loss. Yet, I cling to Your promise that You are close to the brokenhearted. Please draw near to me, heal my wounds, and comfort my spirit. Teach me to lean on Your presence when friendships fade and to find peace in You alone. Help me trust that You see my pain and are working all things for my good. *Thank You for never leaving me.* In Jesus' name, Amen.















#### Your Verse

Psalm 91:4 – "He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 18:10 "The name of the LORD is a fortified tower; the righteous run to it and are safe."
- Isaiah 54:17 "No weapon forged against you will prevail... you will refute every tongue that accuses you."







#### Devotional: God's Shield When You Feel Vulnerable

When friendships from service fade, it can feel like a form of rejection that leaves you vulnerable. You may feel exposed and uncertain, but God's Word offers assurance: under His wings, you find refuge.

Psalm 91 paints a beautiful picture of God's protective care, wrapping His faithful love like a shield around you. Even as humans may fail or misunderstand, God remains your ultimate defender. When facing rejection, intentionally turn to Him as your safe refuge — a place of rest and security beyond the opinions or actions of others.

Trusting God doesn't mean rejection won't hurt, but it reminds you that your worth and protection come from Him, not from human acceptance. This truth grants peace and courage to step forward daily.

1.	How can you remind yourself daily that God is your refuge?
2.	What fears or insecurities arise when you think about rejection?
	In what ways can God's protection change how you respond to distancing friendships?







### **Journaling Prompts**

1.	List times when God has been a refuge to you in past trials.
2.	Write about what it means personally to be 'under His wings.'
3.	Identify fears about rejection and offer them to God in prayer.







#### Prayer for Today

**Lord,** when rejection stings and I feel exposed, remind me that You are my refuge and shield. Cover me with Your feathers and protect me from the hurt that threatens to overwhelm. Help me trust in Your faithfulness more than other's acceptance. Lead me in Your peace and courage today, knowing You fight for me always. *Thank You for being my constant protector.* In Jesus' name, Amen.

















Day 3: **B** Finding Peace Beyond Rejection

#### Your Verse

John 14:27 - "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Philippians 4:7 "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
- Isaiah 26:3 "You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you."







Day 3: 💋 Finding Peace Beyond Rejection

#### Devotional: Embracing Christ's Peace in Troubled Hearts

The pain of friends from your service cutting off ties can trigger inner turmoil and anxiety. Yet, Jesus offers a peace unlike any other—the kind that calms storms within, undisturbed by external circumstances.

John 14:27 reminds us that His peace is a gift, distinct from what the world offers. It's a deep, abiding calm available even amid rejection and grief. Through focusing on Christ and His promises, your heart can find rest.

Peace does not erase hurt but provides a reassuring presence assuring you don't walk emotional pain alone. Lean into God's peace by meditating on His Word, praying, and recalling His faithfulness—especially when feelings of abandonment arise.

Day 3: 💋 Finding Peace Beyond Rejection

#### Prayer for Today

Jesus, thank You for the peace You give—a peace that calms my restless heart and eases my fears. When relationships crumble and my soul trembles, help me to grasp Your gift fully right now. Remind me Your peace is not fleeting but eternal. Teach me to trust You more and not be shaken or afraid in the face of rejection. Let Your perfect peace guard my heart and mind today. Amen.















#### Your Verse

Ephesians 4:31–32 – "Get rid of all bitterness... Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







#### Devotional: Choosing Forgiveness to Free Your Heart

Holding onto bitterness when friends from your service distance can harm your soul deeply. God calls us to release bitterness by embracing forgiveness, reflecting the grace He extended to us through Christ.

Forgiveness doesn't mean minimizing the hurt or forcing reconciliation but freeing your heart from the corrosive power of unforgiveness. By choosing kindness and compassion, you step into God's healing and reflect His love.

As veterans, you understand sacrifice and commitment—now, extend that sacrificial grace inward by forgiving those who have hurt or rejected you. This is a powerful step toward your own restoration and peace.

2.	How does God's forgiveness motivate you to forgive others?
	What changes when you choose kindness and compassion over resentment?







## **Journaling Prompts**

1.	Write honestly about your struggle with bitterness or unforgiveness.
2.	Journal a prayer asking God to help you forgive as He forgave you.
3.	List ways forgiveness could bring healing to your heart and relationships.







#### Prayer for Today

**Gracious Father,** thank You for forgiving me endlessly through Jesus. Help me let go of bitterness and resentment toward those who have hurt me, especially from my time in service. Teach me to be kind and compassionate, walking in Your grace each day. Soften my heart and heal deep wounds through forgiveness, that I may experience Your peace fully. - Romans 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him."







#### Devotional: Trusting God's Plans for Your Future

After broken or distant service friendships, it can be hard to envision new relationships or a hopeful future. Yet God's Word encourages us that He has good plans, full of hope.

Jeremiah 29:11 reassures us that God desires a prosperous future for you, one that includes restoration, new friendships, and deepened joy. He is always at work doing new things—sometimes in ways we least expect.

Rebuilding trust and connection takes time, but with your focus on God's promise, you can face the future with anticipation rather than fear. Open your heart to God's new beginnings—you are not forgotten, and a hopeful future waits.

2.	How can trusting God's plans reduce fear about new connections?
3.	What new 'things' might God be inviting you to perceive in your life?

1.	List hopes or desires you have regarding relationships after service.
2.	Reflect on times God 'did a new thing' in your life before.
3.	Write a prayer asking God to help you embrace His hopeful future.







### **Prayer for Today**

**Heavenly Father,** thank You for the promise of hope and a future filled with Your purposes. Help me believe that You are doing new things in my life, even when the past relationships have faded.
