Isaiah 41:10 - "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

- Psalm 46:1 "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."
- Deuteronomy 31:6 "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."







Day 1: V Finding Strength in God's Presence

Devotional: God's Strength Supports You Today

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 6:31–33 "So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' ... But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."
- Psalm 37:25 "I was young and now I am old, yet I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread."







Devotional: God Provides in Every Season

Facing unemployment after military service can understandably cause anxiety about daily needs and finances. However, God's Word provides a reassuring promise that He will meet all your needs, not by your own efforts alone but through His abundant grace.

Philippians 4:19 reminds us that God's provision is rooted in His glorious wealth and power—far beyond what we can see or control. You can rest in this assurance even when job searches seem slow or discouraging. Matthew 6 urges us to prioritize God's kingdom over worry, trusting that He is working on our behalf.

Additionally, Psalm 37 reflects the experience of many who have walked through seasons of lack but witnessed faithfulness. God has never forsaken His people, and He will not forsake you.

Practice resting in His timing and provision today. It is okay to take a breath, knowing that God's resources extend beyond human limitations. Your value and care are secure in Him, and He is working behind the scenes for your good.

Prayer for Today

Father, thank You that You are the provider of all my needs. I surrender my worries about finances and the unknown future into Your hands. Help me to trust Your perfect timing and abundant resources. Teach me to seek Your kingdom first, knowing You will take care of everything else. Give me peace to rest in Your provision. In Jesus' name, *amen.*

Supporting Scriptures

Devotional: God's Plan for Your Future is Good

Devotional: God's Peace Calms Your Heart

Uncertainty and unemployment can stir up anxiety and unrest in your soul. Yet Jesus offers a profound gift — peace that surpasses the fleeting peace the world offers. John 14:27 assures us that His peace is lasting, unshakable, and given freely.

Devotional: God's Perfect Timing is Always Best
