Devotional: Your Journey to New Life Starts Today

Today marks the start of a new spiritual journey. Addiction tries to convince you that your past mistakes define your worth, but God's Word says otherwise. In 2 Corinthians 5:17, Paul reminds us that becoming a follower of Christ means becoming a new creation. Your addiction history does not imprison your future.

God calls you to *let go* of pain and regret (Isaiah 43:18), inviting you to experience His unfailing compassion and fresh mercies each day (Lamentations 3:22–23). This is not about denial but about surrender—giving your struggles to Christ and trusting Him to make you whole.

Devotional: Renew Your Mind to Resist Cravings

Your mind is the battlefield where addiction often takes hold. Romans 12:2 teaches us not to conform to harmful patterns but to allow God to renew our thinking. This renewal changes our desires, strengthens resolve, and aligns us with God's truth.

Philippians 4:8 encourages filling your thoughts with what is pure and lovely —deliberately choosing to focus on things that build you up rather than tear you down. Taking every thought captive (2 Corinthians 10:5) is an active process requiring awareness, prayer, and God's help.

Guarding your mind means bringing your thoughts under God's authority. When cravings hit, redirect your focus to scripture, worship, or positive distractions. This practice forms new neural pathways away from addiction triggers. Remember, spiritual transformation begins internally, in the way you think.

Devotional: Declare Life-Giving Words Today

Words carry immense power to either build us up or tear us down. Proverbs 18:21 reminds us that what we speak shapes our reality. Addiction often convinces us we are hopeless or weak, but God calls us to speak life and encouragement over ourselves.

Joshua 1:9 commands strength and courage, grounded in God's constant presence. Speak these words over your heart when feelings of defeat arise. Psalm 19:14 challenges us to offer words and thoughts that honor God and build our faith.

Practice speaking affirmations rooted in scripture. Declare your identity as strong, loved, and victorious in Christ. These words transform the internal dialogue surrounding addiction and open the door for God's healing to flourish.

Jesus' promise in John 14:27 reassures you that His peace is a gift, undisturbed by circumstances. Isaiah 26:3 highlights the importance of steady focus on God to experience this perfect peace.

Today, practice surrendering anxiety through intentional prayer and gratitude. This positions your heart for divine peace that calms cravings and provides strength to persevere. Let the Spirit soothe your restless soul and anchor you amidst turmoil.

Day 9:
